

FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, in the Gospel today two of the disciples who were closest to Jesus are reprimanded for their self-seeking ambition. They had asked to be seated in places of honor at the right and left hand of Jesus when they come into the Kingdom. Understandably, the other disciples felt betrayed by this and they all began to argue. Jesus cuts into the conversation by reminding them that they cannot operate like the rest of the world. He, Himself, has given them the example of serving rather than expecting to be served.

This event in the Gospel can help us recognize the many sins that rise up in our hearts and souls when we seek our own advantage at the expense of others. Pride, envy, jealousy, ingratitude, and even a hatred or disdain for those who would stand in the way of our progress and success are all right around the corner when we give in to selfish ambition. In my view, the greatest weapon we have against all these things is gratitude. Daily calling to mind the blessings and gifts we have received from God and expressing our sincere thanks for them is the best way to combat all of these sins of selfishness.

Gratitude puts our hearts and souls in the right disposition before God and our neighbor. Recognizing that all we have and all that we are is, in fact, a gift from God keeps us from power-grabbing ambition or selfish sins. Putting that gratitude into action leads us to generosity, both in thought and deed. Recognizing our neighbor as a gift paves the way for treating them with charity and kindness, paves the way for living out the love of Christ faithfully.

Recognizing that all of our possessions are passing gifts, limited in their value to our time on this earth, helps us to grow in healthy detachment from the things to which we might otherwise cling in a sinful way. The greed that riches can breed leads to selfishness, and selfish behavior. Keeping our focus on protecting our wealth and security blinds us to seeing the need and vulnerability of our neighbors. It is not without purpose that Jesus forbade his disciples from carrying too much with them when He sent them out on mission.

In our day, the needy are needier. As we all know, the cost of everything has risen in recent years. This impacts all of us, but especially those who have nothing. Those for whom shelter and a decent meal might have been just beyond their reach now see a greater gap between themselves and the basic necessities of life. Our own parish is not immune to this.

So, it is that time of year again when I ask all of you to consider a modest increase in your weekly or monthly giving to St. Michael's. For those of you who are able to do so, consider a \$5 increase in what you contribute each week or month to the Basilica. My request is that you increase your weekly giving by whatever amount you are able in a consistent way. Maybe that's a

\$1 increase, maybe this year it's no increase at all. I have no expectation for you to give beyond your means, but I ask that you prayerfully put this before God. Thank you!
