MEMORIAL OF THE PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

- 1. His birth was predicted by an angel before Mary's Annunciation
 - The Archangel Gabriel appeared to his father, Zechariah, in the Temple to announce John's birth. This happened six months before Gabriel visited Mary, making John about half a year older than Jesus (Luke 1:26).
- 2. His parents were elderly and considered barren
 - His mother Elizabeth conceived him in old age, which is why his birth was regarded as miraculous. Zechariah
 initially doubted the angel's message and was struck mute until John was born.
- 3. His name broke family tradition
 - When Elizabeth declared the baby's name would be "John" (meaning "God is gracious"), relatives protested because
 no one in their family had that name. Zechariah confirmed it by writing it on a tablet, and immediately regained his
 speech.
- 4. He lived as a Nazarite from birth
 - Like Samson, John was likely bound by the Nazarite vow no wine, no cutting of hair, and a life dedicated entirely to God
- 5. He wore camel hair and ate locusts and that wasn't entirely strange
 - Locusts were a kosher food (Leviticus 11:22), and his outfit echoed the prophet Elijah's (2 Kings 1:8). The Gospel
 emphasizes this to highlight his role as Elijah's prophetic successor.

- 6. He likely began his ministry in his late twenties
 - In line with Jewish tradition for a priestly calling, John seems to have started preaching around age 30, shortly before Jesus began His public ministry.
- 7. He baptized in a location with deep symbolic meaning
 - Many scholars believe John's baptisms took place at Bethany across the Jordan, near where Joshua led Israel into the Promised Land — symbolizing a new spiritual exodus.
- 8. He is the only saint whose birth and death are both celebrated
 - Most saints are remembered only on the date of their death.
 John's nativity (June 24) and beheading (August 29) are both major feasts in the Christian calendar.
- 9. Jesus called him the greatest "born of women"
 - In Matthew 11:11, Jesus says no one greater had arisen yet adds that the least in the Kingdom of Heaven is greater than John, showing the shift from the Old Covenant to the New.
- 10. His bones and relics have a mysterious history
 - Relics claiming to be his head exist in multiple places including Rome, France, and even Syria — leading to centuries of debate over authenticity.


