

FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, this Sunday the Church celebrates the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The celebration is such a good reminder for all of us of the gift that family life is. Our family experience, though so vastly complex and admittedly a different reality for each one of us, is meant to convey the truth that we are not designed for life alone. We are made for communion and for love. Of course, not everyone receives the love that they should from their family, and perhaps we are guilty too of not showing the love to our family that we ought, but for most, family is a place of safety, security, and love.

As I have shared many times before, much of my family is Italian, so there is no shortage of drama and conflict in our family gatherings. We are a lively bunch! Even the non-Italians leap into the fray every once in awhile. But no matter how upset or aggravated we can become with one another, it is so important to realize the gift that the people in our lives are to us. Not infrequently, someone will come to me for counsel regarding a family member who has wronged them or offended them in some way. We can all get caught up in the anger and resentment connected with such actions.

But my advice is almost always the same. Perhaps I have shared this counsel before, but no matter how upset we can become with someone, even justifiably so, it is good to imagine what life would be like without that person. Almost always, even with someone who has hurt us deeply, we would be saddened by totally losing them. We want them in our life. When we realize that truth, we come to a moment of gratitude and forgiveness. We can more easily forgive the person because we recognize their value. We can also give thanks to God for making the person a part of our life.

While this does not always fix everything, it goes a long way to keeping the communion of our family as it should be, one of love. Love is the binding force that unites our family life, not blood! Our family life is meant to be a manifestation of the communion that is the Holy Trinity. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are one, divine unity and mystery. Can we not say the same of our families?

Hopefully, you have experienced the unity of family life, but have you considered the mystery of it? How is it that we love our family members as much as we do? Is it merely biological or the result of a shared experience of life? Or does the truth go much deeper than that? Is it not that God has instilled in us a love for one another that is born from grace? As with all of God's graces, we can reject them and betray them. We only lose when we choose this path.

This Sunday, as we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, may we give thanks to God together for our earthly families, even those members of our lives who are bound to us more by love than by blood. They

are God's gift to us and we to them. May we find strength, refuge, and love in the communion of the family that God has given to us.
