



FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, yesterday, our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrated Yom Kippur. This is the holiest day of the year for Judaism and it celebrates God's forgiveness and the people's atonement for their sins. It is a day of fasting and repentance as the Jewish people turn back to God and receive His forgiveness. Fasting is a powerful way to pray. We may not think of fasting as prayer, but it certainly is!

This past week, Pope Francis called the whole Church to observe a day of prayer and fasting on Monday as we pray for peace. Throughout the scriptures, fasting has accompanied the heartfelt prayer of God's people. Fasting is one of the many forms of self denial that we can observe to add an exclamation point to our prayer. St. Peter acknowledges in the Gospel today that the disciples who are following Jesus have "given up everything" to follow Him.

Jesus responds by telling Him that "there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more..." So, a question we can frequently ask ourselves is: "What am I denying myself to increase my faith?" This is something we are accustomed to doing during the holy season of Lent, but in actuality, is something to be practiced throughout the year.

Fasting does not need to entail a complete denial of food, but is perhaps even more effective when nobody knows that we're doing it. Giving up food items that we crave (like ice cream, salt, sugar, or caffeine) can perpetuate a hunger in our bodies that serves to remind us of the hunger we should have for God. Engaging our will, our decision making power, over the appetites that we experience can also strengthen our will for those temptations that come that we might not anticipate. When we deny one hunger, we grow in our ability to deny them all.

In the Gospels, Jesus calls us to take up our crosses, yes, but before even that, He commands that we deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow after Him. Our self denial comes first. It is so important that we not see this as a denial of our human worth or dignity. Rather, denying ourselves to follow faithfully after Jesus is the best way of celebrating the greatness of our human dignity! We deny ourselves as Jesus did in His brief life on earth. The fact that we can imitate Him in this reminds us of our nature created in His image and likeness. Our dignity is beyond imagining.

The Book of Wisdom in our first reading today reminds us that Wisdom is that gift we seek above all because it is Wisdom that unites us to God. "Beyond health and comeliness I loved her and I chose to have her rather than the light." As we enter into the prayer of this Mass and prepare to dedicate ourselves to prayer in a consistent and decisive way, may the Wisdom of the Lord guide us so that we can deny

ourselves and faithfully follow after Christ.


