



FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, it is not easy for us to fully comprehend the magnitude of what occurs in today's first reading from Nehemiah. The People of Israel had been separated from one another and their homeland for so long! What is worse, is the fact that, as a result of their exile, they had been cut off from the practice of their religion. The temple had been destroyed, their one place of offering worthy sacrifice to God. The priests had been disbanded and exiled along with the people. There was no one to offer the prayers or lead their worship.

Imagine being carted off to the other side of the world, to a place where there are no Christian churches, no priests or even Protestant ministers. Even if there were people who could preach the Word of God, it was forbidden to do so. Imagine the impact of living for generations with only the stories of the memories of your grandparents and elders to tell you about what they remember of going to church. Imagine the descriptions of stained glass windows and cathedrals (and Basilicas!) without ever having seen one. Imagine the devastating effect of not having any access at all to the Bible or to God's Word, but only being able to hear from what your family and those who raised you recalled of their reading of Scripture.

Then, amazingly, it is all reversed and you are permitted to return home. The ruins of the church your family had described to you are still standing. They certainly are a mere shadow of their former glory, but they are still standing and you can see among the ruins some of the detail that they had described to you. Then, from some other part of the world, the priests who had been taken away were allowed to return and, perhaps in the Sacristy, they discover the ritual books that had been banned and a Bible that had survived.

What would it be like to hear those authentic words for the first time in ages? This is what they are hearing in our first reading today. This is why the people are "weeping as they heard the words of the law". They had longed to hear God's Word! They had desired to return home, perhaps imagining that they would never be able to do so... yet here they are! Can you imagine the joy they experienced? "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." This phrase comes from the works of the Latin poet Sextus Propertius. It is a bit different from what he actually wrote, but the gist is the same.

Do we cherish the Word of God and the practice of our faith as much as we should? Would we cherish it more if it were taken away from us and we were prevented from coming to Mass? Do we have the Words of the Bible ingrained in our minds and hearts so that, God forbid, should there come a time when we find ourselves prevented from gathering in worship or hearing the Word proclaimed, we can still abide in It because It abides in us? Cherish the Word of God; read the Bible; make every book of its pages a part of yourself. If your children or grandchildren never had access to a

Bible and they asked you to tell them what it said... would you be able to do so? Make sure your

answer is yes!
