

#### FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, November is a month dedicated to interceding and praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, all of the Faithful departed. Beginning as we did on Friday with All Saints' Day and on Saturday with All Souls' Day, we have prayed for and with all those who have left this life in the friendship of God. They, too, pray for us. Both feasts are reminders of the reality in which we live in the Church, namely, the Communion of Saints. Each of these two words, "Communion" and "Saints" conveys truth about our life in the Church.

We live in communion. Our ecclesial notion of communion goes beyond camaraderie or being unified by a common goal. It is more than merely sharing the same faith convictions or beliefs. The communion in which we participate is a vital bond of grace that unites us as the Body of Christ with Jesus as the head. It is a communion that is lived in action, sustained by faith and grace, and enlivened by the Holy Spirit who brings vitality to the Body of Christ. It is a communion that is expressed in our reception of Holy Communion. Receiving Holy Communion is an action that communicates this bond of unity in belief, action, and the lived reality of our mortal life. This is our life in the Church.

The word "saints" does not refer to perfect people. The "sancti" are the holy ones. The saints, in this sense, are all those on earth, in purgatory, and in heaven who are united to Jesus in the Body of Christ. They are saints, not so much by their own merit or earthly performance, but because of the bond with Jesus Christ. It is He who sanctifies us and makes us holy. This is hard to understand. When I was first introduced to the saints, canonized saints, I remember thinking that they were the perfect. They had lived their lives so freely from sin that the Church believes them to be in heaven.

Part of this is true. The Church *does* believe them to be in heaven, but they were far from perfect. These saints lived exemplary lives of faith, no doubt. But they all sinned. They are in heaven, not because they earned their way in, but because of the fact that they, like us, put their faith in Jesus, repented of their sin, and followed Him on the way of grace. They struggled through the mire of temptation and, when they fell into sin, begged pardon for what they had done. But they also grew in strength and virtue such that the Church puts them before us as models to follow.

We live in the Communion of Saints now. When we profess our belief in this communion, we are not expressing a future hope, but a present reality. Like all the saints who have gone before us, we are called to turn away from sin, to live in fidelity and virtue, to do what is right and good at all times, and to love God and neighbor with our all. November is a month that celebrates this communion by calling us to pray for those who are on that journey in purgatory. May the Lord bring them and us into the light of His heavenly kingdom!


