FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, the readings this week point to the theme of generosity. With the poor widow of Zarephath in the first reading, the gift of the poor widow in the Gospel, and the description of Christ's own gift of His life for us in the second reading, we learn that no amount of poverty keeps us from being generous. None of the three people here has anything substantial to give. What wealth did Jesus have? But all three of them were admirably and heroically generous!

The widow of Zarephath, in the most profound impoverishment, put God first by offering what little she had to His prophet when asked. She is not only an example of generosity, but of true faith. Even when death for her and her child was imminent since they were quite literally starving, she gave God and His prophet what she could. The same can be said of the poor widow who put what little she had into the temple treasury.

This can give us great comfort. Maybe we don't have the individual resources to establish scholarships and foundations, maybe our meagre resources will not suffice to do what others are able to do, but there is no limit to how generous we can be. The limits of our generosity are not measured in dollars and cents, but in heart and soul! How much would we give if we could? How many people would we help if we were able?

Jesus makes it clear in His own words that the pennies the poor widow put into the temple treasury were more than all the other contributors because of the fact that those pennies represented so much for her. I am so grateful for every penny that each of you donates to St. Michael's because I know how hard it can be to give.

How easy it would have been for the widow to pass by the treasury! It would have been understandable and acceptable, even to God, for her to hold on to those few pennies out of the great need that she had. But she didn't walk by. She didn't ignore the call to give. She knew that she would be happy as a result of what she had given.

We are coming in to that time of year commonly referred to as the "Season of Giving". We can find real and true joy in giving from the heart. We will have opportunities to provide pajamas for young children, gifts for the poor, food for the homeless, presents for family and friends, I'm sure. But the first fruits, the best of what we have to offer should go to God. The widow of Zarephath and the poor widow in the Gospel both understood that. They did not give out of guilt or even obligation, but out of faith and hope. So can we!

Be generous to our collections and especially our poor boxes, be generous to our efforts to provide for the less fortunate, the needy and the underprivileged. Be generous to God and all of your neighbors! How greatly Jesus must have blessed this poor widow who was so highly praised in the Gospel! She probably had no idea, even to the end of her life, that Jesus had pointed her out so powerfully and thus made her

a part of His Gospel forever!

Prison Ministry Team


