5TH SUNDAY OF LENT April 6, 2025

My dear friends, on this 5th Sunday of Lent a long observed custom begins of draping our crosses and statues in dark

cloths until the Easter celebration begins. The covering of our statuary is a stark reminder that, without the Lord and all of the good graces that come from Him, our life would be bleak indeed! One of the presentations that I have offered in the past to people considering becoming Catholic focuses on what the world would be like without Christianity or the Church. Can you imagine?!

We can never escape the fact that every person on earth, comprising the membership of the Church, is a sinner. In that sense, we have to take the good with the bad. But how often do we consider the tremendous good that we receive simply by having the Church? It is Jesus who gives us the Church. The Church is not a man-made institution that we have to begrudgingly accommodate in order to make things work. She is a Divine Institution and as the Body of Christ, she has Christ as her head.

Take a moment and consider what life would be like without the Church: no saints to admire, no prayers being offered, no sacred places or sanctuaries, no choirs, or hymns, no Christmas or Easter celebrations, no community or solidarity; we would not have the comfort of a funeral nor the joy of a wedding... so much would be lost. Veiling our crosses and statues serves to remind us of how empty our life would be without Jesus and the Church He has given us. May these cloths lead us to deeper and more sincere gratitude to God for the gifts of grace we receive from Him.





If walked out 40 years ago. Turned my back. It's not like I haven't spent time in church or searched for a different way. I've done all that. I've gone to other churches, searched aimlessly, seeking a way that would solve my problems, ease my pain, and bring me peace. That word PEACE was so elusive, for so very long - for 40 years.

Through that time the tears came without warning, like a wellspring, long forgotten, and buried deep. So deep that I could almost forget the pain was still there. I hid. I hid from myself, from the pain, the failures in my life, and the longing. As we do, I went on living, but not truly alive. I married, had children, worked diligently toward the future. Divorced. Rebuilding... rebuilding... rebuilding. And then, falling again, failing, and climbing back up. Raising my children, fighting for their lives, their futures, their hopes, their dreams. Was I a good mother? Am I a good mother? I would ask myself this, over, and over, and over.

I named her Grace. I was 21 years old. I was alone. Her father left. My family was ashamed. My mother blamed me. I hid, again. At times I'd wished I could take both of our lives. So, I gave my daughter up for adoption and for a better life than I could provide. I thought our lives were worth nothing. How wrong I was 37 years later.

When the phone rang, it was like any other day. But it was the most important day of my life. My sister was on the other end of the phone. "23 and me," she said. "Grace is looking for you," she said. "She has some questions." "Anything," I answered, "anything she wants to know, tell her."

Grace came back into my life right before Christmas of 2023. Three days later, I took this photo of what appears to me to be a cross next to the moon outside my window where I sat. It was the first sign.

Her adoptive mother had named her Christine, but my Grace came back into my life without judgement of me. She needed for herself and my two granddaughters, Grace and Nora, who are now six years old. She came back into my life as a brilliant shining beacon of light, hope, and joy, bringing back with her, all that I had given away years ago.

This past December (2024) was the first time I was able to spend the Christmas season with all three of my children, and it was the first time that Christine met her brother and

sister, Leo and Ali. Once everyone went their own way, I went to Midnight Mass at the Basilica of Saint Michael the Archangel. I listened to Father Fowler explain that sometimes you don't have to say anything. Making the simple sign of the cross is enough for others to see God at work in your life.

I have since become a parishioner and renewed my faith in Christ. The 40 years of mistakes and drifting have melted away and have been replaced by God's infinite love for ALL OF US. We are one united family through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As if I needed more proof, today's 9AM homily was about the Prodigal Son returning home and not being able to see what is right in front of you. I can now see the brilliance of God's Grace in my life. He has affirmed my faith and rewarded me in ways that I cannot even express or explain. He has made all the wrongs right and forgiven me for every transgression. I am in the right place.




