Grain
Cost of a bag of grain \$ / lbs in the bag = \$ per lb
Amount fed: lns per day X days (in a month) =lbs
Monthly cost of grain: \$ X lbs = monthly cost of grain
(cost per lb) x (total amount fed)
Hay
Cost of a bale of hay \$ / lbs per bale = \$ per lb
Amount fed: lbs per day X days (in a month) = lbs
Monthly cost of hay: \$ X lbs = monthly cost of hay
(cost per lb) x (total amount fed)
Supplements
Cost of package \$ / oz or lb per container = \$ per oz / lb
Amount fed: oz / lb per day X days (in a month) = oz / lb
Monthly cost of supplements: \$ oz / lb = monthly cost of hay
(cost per oz/ lb) x (total amount fed)
