## Boyd K. Packer, Ensign, November 1994, 60.

The Holy Ghost speaks with a voice that you *feel* more than you *hear*. It is described as a "still small voice." And while we speak of 'listening' to the whisperings of the Spirit, most often one describes a spiritual prompting by saying, 'I had a *feeling* ...' .... Revelation comes as words we *feel* more than *hear*. Nephi told his wayward brothers, who were visited by an angel, "Ye were past *feeling*, that ye could not *feel* his words."

I testify [that the Spirit] is a small voice. It whispers not shouts. And so you must be very quiet inside. That is why you may wisely fast when you want to listen. And that is why you will listen best when you feel, 'Father, thy will, not mine, be done.' You will have a feeling of 'I want what you want.' Then the still small voice will seem as if it pierces you. It may make your bones to quake. More often it will make your heart burn within you, again softly, but with a burning which will lift and reassure.

Not so different are we today! We want the glamour and frothiness of the world, not always realizing the penalties of our folly ... Others ... indulge in their social drinking-"we must have a king like unto other nations."

date present wardrobes and create business for merchants. We cannot be different. We would rather die than be 'not up to date.' If the dress is knee length, me must go a little above the knee. Now, the word create came from the word *baurau* which does not mean to create out of nothing; it means to organize; the same as a man would organize materials and build a ship. The pure principles of elements are principles which can never be destroyed; they may be organized and re-organized, but not destroyed. They had no beginning, and can have no end.

## Joseph Fielding Smith, Answers to Gospel Questions, 1:74.

David committed a dreadful crime, and all his life afterwards sought for forgiveness. Some of the Psalms portray the anguish of his soul; yet David is still paying for his sin. He did not receive the resurrection at the time of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Peter declared that his body was still in the tomb [Acts 2:29], and the Prophet Joseph Smith has said, "David sought repentance at the hand of God carefully with tears, for the murder of Uriah; but he could only get it through hell: he got a promise that his soul should not be left in hell [*TPJS*, 339]." Again, we ask: Who wishes to spend a term in hell with the devil before being cleansed from sin?

### Bruce R. McConkie, Mormon Doctrine, 520.

Murderers are forgiven eventually but only in the sense that all sins are forgiven except the sin against the Holy Ghost; they are not forgiven in the sense that celestial salvation is made available to them (Matt. 12:31-32; *TPJS*, 356-57). After they have paid the full penalty for their crime, they shall go on to a telestial inheritance (Rev.22:15).

Forgiveness will come eventually to all repentant souls who have not committed the unpardonable sin (Matt. 12:31). Forgiveness does not, however, necessarily assure exaltation, as is the case with David (see D&C 132:38-39; see also Ps. 16:10; Acts 2:25-27; *TPJS*, 339).

### Joseph F. Smith, Gospel Doctrine, 56.
