Mega makes a statement in D-II debut; Eagles fly past defending state champs; Tigers, Panthers both pounce

There weren't a lot of teams in Division I that could stop East Greenwich's Alex Mega. If Wednesday's was any indication, there won't be many in Division II that will be either.

Mega, the state's leading scorer the last two seasons, made her presence known early and often Wednesday. She scored in transition, in the lane and from deep, pouring in 32 points as the Avengers' rolled to a 57-31 win over Cumberland.

The senior didn't waste much time. She scored 12 points in the first quarter and had 10 in the second as EG took a 29-14 lead into halftime. Two quick 3-pointers and a layup later she hit the 30-point mark and she exited the game for good after an early bucket in the fourth quarter.

Other Avengers did some scoring as well. Gabi Jackson put up weight in the win and Meghan Pagliaro and Sophia Schwarzman both had five in the win.

East Greenwich's relentless pressure made it hard for Cumberland to get into an offense and limited the Clippers' chances to outside the arc. Bridgitt O'Sullivan-Van Etten led Cumberland with eight points in the loss.
