





Sep. 20th Visit to S.A.L.T. Meeting (Study of Ancient Lifeways and Technologies): After the September 20 Rim Country Chapter Meeting, several attendees went to the SALT Meeting this month in Pine north of Payson. They were late, but this did not create a problem. Each meeting is a hands-on personal learning experience to carry out some ancient technology or skill. Materials are provided and everyone is very helpful. This month the technology was making a basket. A pile of long sprouted streamers harvested from some stumps was available material participants first selected six starter twigs and easily stripped them of leaves. SALT guides at the meeting instructed how to arrange them and tie them together with additional long twigs to form the base. Then, instructions and help were given to form the sides of the basket with more twigs.

Like AAS Phoenix Chapter, the SALT club has met for years at the grounds of S'edav Va'aki Museum (formerly Pueblo Grande) down in the Phoenix Valley, but both are now having to meet elsewhere. Unfortunatley, SALT meets at time overlapping RCC monthly meetings.



will attend, and they are always interesting, a load of fun, and will put you in contact with many of the talented potters interested in turning mud into something beautiful and useful "from scratch." The event includes presentations, a tour of the incredible Mills Collection—one of the better public displays of Salado polychrome (red/white/black) pottery—and even trips to collect some local clays that have proven to be good. "Kiln" (these are outdoor trench kilns or surface firings) setup is Saturday morning, with additional demos that afternoon catered dinner & trade blanket (which is a ton of fun) that evening. Sunday morning will include surface oxidation firings and opening of the reduction-firings from the day before.
