

Everyone, please bring a knife and a pecking hammer stone if you have one. Also, if you have a fresh, slightly curved tree branch about 14" to 18" long about the thickness of your thumb. We will peck a divot for the bow drill socket and also learn how to make 4-ply cordage for the bow drill string.






SKILL #2 CORDAGE: Level I

PARFLECHE INFO by Ron Moses



What is Parfleche? Parfleche is a tough, un-tanned animal hide—traditionally made from buffalo—soaked in lye and water to remove the hair, then stretched and dried. Indigenous peoples of the Plains and Northwest used parfleche to craft shields, drums, and most commonly, decorated carrying cases, which also came to be called parfleches.

These durable, beautifully painted cases were essential for travel and storage—and remain a striking example of Native artistry and utility.

Per Andy Ward's suggestion, any of our members interested in reproducing ancient SW pottery should definitely check out the SW Kiln Conference https://www.swkiln.com/ which will be held in Arizona (Safford) for the first time in several years, on October 16-19. This year's will be the fourth one I will attend, and they are always interesting, a load of fun, and will put you in contact with many of the talented potters interested in turning mud into something beautiful and useful "from scratch." The event includes presentations, a tour of the incredible Mills Collection--one of the better public displays of Salado polychrome (red/white/black) pottery--and even trips to collect some local clays that have proven to be good. "Kiln" (these are outdoor trench kilns or surface firings) set-up is Saturday morning, with additional demos that afternoon catered dinner & trade blanket (which is a ton of fun) that evening. Sunday morning will include surface oxidation firings and opening of the reduction-firings from the day before. 


