



Great presentation on how the Indigenous people passed along their history and beliefs for thousands of years before they had a written language. Peter showed several ways this was done, going in depth into how the O'odham did it, and how the people of the Great Plains area of North America did it. Their methods were very different and yet they shared some common aspects. Part of the presentation included photos of what they used and gave details of exactly what the story was they were documenting.

At the end of the presentation everyone began recording their own history - without using writing - by making one of the items used by the Indigenous people to record their history.

### **DUCT TAPE FLETCHING with Tom Wax**


Duct Tape is a modern invention that can be used for a lot of things from repairs to making things, etc. It should always be in one's survival kit. Here is one idea that can be used that you may not know about. You can make Atlatl Dart fletching's or arrow fletching's with it. It really makes good fletching in an emergency or non-emergency situation.



I started with some card stock paper and made fletching veins. This is not necessary, but it helps with the stiffness. I cut the paper down to the size and shape that I want.



I attached the fletching to the shaft and added duct tape to the other side of the paper fletching vein and trimmed off the excess leaving a little to attach to the shaft.



This shows the complete fletching's attached to the shaft. I used brightly colored duct tape so you can find your arrow or Atlatl dart. These are three vein fletching's on Atlatl Darts.






