BONE BLADED KNIFE by Ron Moses



I recently completed this example of a bone bladed knife and yucca stalk sheath. The knife is 19cm length (7.5in). Blade was shaped from a blank split from an American Bison leg bone and is hafted into an ash handle with pine pitch adhesive and sinew binding. Sheath was shaped

from a yucca flower stalk that was split, inletted, and reassembled with pine pitch and sinew.

AN OBSIDIAN BOULDER by Luis Ahumada



Oh S-Knapp! (Couldn't resist) It's already March! That's hard to believe. February came and went, and it marked an interesting milestone for me. This last month was the 2-year anniversary of my beginnings in flint knapping. (Huge shoutout to Bob Sizemore for running that intro to knapping class and suggesting our monthly knapping circles every SALT meeting. Much love and many prayers your way, sir!) Anyways! I've been thinking about doing something crazy with my Christmas present from the Wax family. No, I'm not

referring to the gold-sheen obsidian that many of you have now seen (though I will continue to play with that). Tom and Diane also gave me an additional block of obsidian which weighs in at a ridiculous 28.4 lbs.! Between my own intrusive thoughts and a conversation I had with a friend concerning how much waste is made in the process of creating any given stone tool, I decided to go on a journey with this small boulder. I'm going to knapp as many points as I can (large or small) and keep track of the loss in weight from the original rock to the finished pieces.

Yes, my sanity is questionable! I expect this project to take months if not years to properly complete (given the necessity to work for a living). I will update everyone as frequently as I can, but please don't be a pest! Remember, I will be in possession of MANY sharp objects. - Luis

FISHING HAND LINE SET by Ron Moses





Fishing hand line set: The hook is made from a split and shaped deer foot bone, using a method originally taught to me by Thomas Robins. The winder is carved from Desert Fern wood and has about 15 meters (50 feet) of 3 ply twisted flax fiber cordage and a shell added for weight. Flax makes an excellent natural cordage for fish line as it is a fiber that becomes stronger when wet. The dry flax line tests out to about 9 kilograms (20 pounds) breaking strength.







