# **Attention All Members**

Effective July 1st, FLMC will be implementing, for a 6-month test period, an **After Hours Emergency Number**. The number is 360-868-8281. It should be called **only** after Business Hours and **only** for emergencies related to Fawn Lake services such as Water, Gate, Roads or Parks. If you are having a personal emergency, please call 911 immediately.

When you call the Emergency Number you will reach one of our two Water Technicians, either Troy Henderson or Neal Adams. They will review your concern and if water related, they will do their best to assist you. If this is a non-water issue that needs to be handled after hours, they will pass your information onto another Fawn Lake Team Member.

When you call the Office after Business Hours (see side panel), the emergency phone number will be repeated three times during the voicemail greeting. It would be helpful if you can write the number down somewhere easy to see in case of an emergency.

During Business Hours, call the office at 360-426-1657 to report your Fawn Lake-related emergency.

# It is that time of year again! We all need to keep our properties clear of fire hazards including tall grass & weeds

With NOAA and all the weather agencies forecasting a dry, hot summer we need to be vigilant about keeping our lawns mowed and flammable debris cleared away from our lots. Think community safety and protecting our investments.

# **Fawn Lake Water Restrictions Continue**

Water restrictions began June 1st. Lots with an odd-number address are free to water on the odd days of the month. For lots with an even-number address, you can water on the even days of the month. If you feel you need to vary your watering from this established schedule, pick up a "Request for Variance" form in the office. This permit is not required for hand watering, only for sprinklers and installed sprinkler systems.

# **MESSAGES FROM OUR BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

# **Steve Jacobson: Treasurer**

- We have received our tax return form our CPA, and are paying zero taxes for 2023.
- The CPA completed our audit and found that our processes we have implemented meet all requirements for accounting purposes. We have 3 check signers, 2 people who are the controllers of fund transfers, a bookkeeper who handles the matching of paperwork, and the treasurer, who reviews all.
- The Board has approved a Financial Commitment on how funds will be handled in the future, focusing all Reserve funds on Capital Expenditures.
- We have paid the bills for the pipe work on the dam, and for the lake treatment.

# **Heather Tremblay: Gate and Community**

- Fawn Lake Life Jacket Station: Mason County Fire Dist. #4 and Verle's have come together to pay for and build a life jacket station for Fawn Lake residents! Please set aside your gently used life vests and jackets to contribute to this upcoming safety feature at our lake.
- <u>Fireworks Safety:</u> Washing State has laws around setting off fireworks and suggestions for fireworks safety. Please review these by <u>clicking the link here</u> and let's all enjoy a safer, cleaner, more neighborly 4th of July celebration this year. See page 4 for more information.
- Free CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) Training: Are you prepared for an emergency? Would you like the skills and equipment needed to help your family and community in the event of an earthquake, fire, or other disaster? - ◆ EVAC Protocol and Alerts: In the event of a fire or emergency, it's important to be prepared. If you call 911 to report a community-wide emergency in Fawn Lake, please call the FLMC office or our new emergency phone # as well. Sign up for CODE RED and Alert Sense (click on links for more information) to receive alerts from local government.

# **Bill Knight: Water**

- Emergency Water Issue at Well #2: Thank you to the community for your conservation efforts and your patience as we replaced a leaking valve at the well. Your efforts ensured we had enough water until the repair could be made. All wells were put back online Monday afternoon.
- Water Restrictions: Water restrictions went in effect June 1st. We implement these restrictions to conserve our water supply during the summer months. It is especially important that we all adhere to these restrictions since we had a low snow pack this winter.
- Charging for water over usage: Just a reminder that water is included in your dues unless you
  use more than 40,000 gallons in a quarter. Per our bylaws, May began a new quarter for measuring water usage. For more information on Water Conservation Fees check out Chapter 14,
  Section O, Subsection 3.

# SUGGESTED GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW:

- 1. **Choose a Safe Location**: Find an open area away from buildings, dry grass, and other flammable materials. Ensure there's enough space for the fireworks to launch without hitting anything.
- 2. **Follow Local Laws**: Always adhere to local regulations regarding fireworks. Some areas may have restrictions or bans. SEE WASHINGTON STATE/MASON COUNTY LAWS BELOW
- 3. **Adult Supervision**: Only adults should handle fireworks. Keep them out of reach of children.
- 4. **Read Instructions**: Carefully read the instructions for each firework. Follow the recommended safety precautions.
- 5. **Stability**: Place fireworks on a stable surface before lighting them. If it's windy, consider using sand or rocks to stabilize them.
- 6. **Keep Water Nearby**: Have a bucket of water or a hose nearby to extinguish any accidental fires.
- 7. **Light One at a Time**: Light one firework at a time and move away quickly. Don't try relighting a "dud." Dunk in water and dispose of immediately.
- 8. **Stand Back**: Maintain a safe distance after lighting a firework. Follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 9. **Eye Protection**: Wear safety glasses to protect your eyes from debris.
- 10. **Dispose Properly**: After the fireworks have cooled down, soak them in water before disposing of them in a metal dumpster provided.

Washington State Law (RCW 70.77.395) allows consumer fireworks to be discharged between the hours of:

## TIP OF THE MONTH

PARENTS! If you allow your child to go down to the lake without supervision, you are held responsible for educating your child to NOT jump from the bridge. We do not have insurance to cover any claims made due to any injuries that might occur. The bridge is marked very clearly—"No jumping from bridge". A fine could be involved if you allow your child to jump from the bridge. Please prevent this situation from occurring.


