CALF旗下有七个微信群、共2300多位群友,其中900多位是分布在全美三十多个州的华人律师,约180多位是取得美国律师资格后返回中国的海归律师,另有法学生和其他从业涉及美国法律的成员无数。《围炉夜话》系列节目、律所或公司的招聘信息以及线上线下活动的信息均会在CALF上发布。CALF也是群友之间互相学习、增进合作、抱团取暖的平台。

"美律苗"由在美华裔律师——曹英律师牵头建立,旨在为律师同行、美国法学院学生、有志于攻读法学院学位的同学和对美国法律感兴趣的朋友提供一个信息分享和交流的平台。现阶段"美律苗"公众号以分享《围炉夜话》系列节目为主,并不定期分享律所、公司等招聘信息,未来将会分享线上线下活动的信息。

The Chinese American Lawyers Forum (CALF) is a nonprofit organization founded and led by attorney Ying Cao in the Greater New York area. CALF's mission is to support the professional development and networking of Chinese attorneys practicing in the U.S. through both online and in-person events.

CALF currently runs seven active WeChat groups with over 2,300 members. Among them, more than 900 are Chinese attorneys practicing across 30+ U.S. states, about 180 are U.S.-licensed attorneys who have returned to practice in China, and the rest include law students and professionals working in U.S. law-related fields. CALF regularly shares job postings, information on law firm and corporate opportunities, and hosts its signature Fireside Chat series. It has become a key hub for learning, collaboration, and community among Chinese legal professionals.

"Mei Lü Miao" is a WeChat platform also launched by Ying Cao, created for lawyers, law students, prospective law school applicants, and anyone interested in U.S. law. At this stage, the platform primarily shares content from the Fireside Chat series and job opportunities, and will gradually expand to include updates on upcoming events and broader legal insights.

CALFONGOING PROGRAMS

Building a Community: Online, Offline, and On Air

In 2021, amid the global pandemic, CALF launched the "Fireside Chats" podcast series, hosted by Qi Li, Keliang Zhu, and Ying Cao. These candid and thoughtful conversations with Chinese American legal professionals have become a cornerstone of our community.

Aired every 2–3 weeks on Zoom and streamed on Bilibili, WeChat Channel, and Xiaoe, the podcast has produced 86 episodes, featuring around 120 guests, including lawyers, in-house counsel, law professors, and judges. The series has attracted over 10,000 viewers to date.

IST ANNUAL CONFERENCE RECAP

CALF's First Conference - April 19-20, 2024





CALF's first annual conference was held at the picturesque Tarrytown House Estate in upstate New York. It brought together 108 lawyers from 19 U.S. states, as well as Mainland China and Hong Kong, representing a wide range of practice areas and organizations—from BigLaw and boutique firms to in-house legal teams and government agencies.

The conference featured deep, candid conversations on the challenges and breakthroughs in the careers of Chinese American lawyers. Topics included:

- · Bottlenecks in legal career advancement
- Solo vs. partnership models
- · Women in law
- · Law firm marketing and growth strategies
- · Legal community advocacy

The keynote address was delivered by Keliang "Clay" Zhu, Managing Partner of DeHeng Law Offices PC in Silicon Valley, who shared his pivotal role in organizing legal resistance to the WeChat ban during the Trump administration. Panels featured top practitioners including Zhangmao Tong (Locke Lord), Haiyan Tang (Quinn Emanuel), Xin Tao (Baker McKenzie), Weiqiong Tao (Polsinelli), and more. Impact Litigation by Chinese American Lawyers against Racial Discrimination: the Good, the Bad, and the Ugly

April 25, 2025 | 9:30 - 10:30 AM

Keliang Clay Zhu

Course summary: The session discusses the recent civil rights lawsuits against federal and state racists laws and policies, including two high-profile pending lawsuits against Florida's alien land law and SB 846, the recently filed case by Prof. Franklin Tao against University of Kansas for racial discrimination, and the Freedom of Information Act cases against federal agencies to uncover racial profiling in the enforcement of the "China Initiative". The session will discuss the legal strategies behind these public-interest lawsuits including how to use the 14th Amendment and the federal preemption principle to challenge racially biased state laws.

Speaker: Keliang "Clay" Zhu, CALDA

Clay received his J.D. from Willamette University College of Law in 2000 and has more than twenty years' experience in cross-border litigation and regulatory compliance. He is admitted in California, Oregon, the 9th Circuit, the DC Circuit, and the US Supreme Court. He is the managing partner of DeHeng Law Offices' Silicon Valley office, and has been frequently interviewed by major news outlets including the Reuters, the Wall Street Journal, and the Financial Times. Clay is also the president of a non-profit legal aid organization called the Chinese American Legal Defense Alliance that litigates racial discrimination cases for Asian Americans.



PLENARY SESSION 3

How are We Doing? A Three-year Survey on the Career Development and Paths of Chinese American Lawyers

Prof. Ji Li

Course summary: The session summarizes the findings and trends in a three-year survey conducted by Prof. Li among first-generation Chinese American lawyers. The study focuses on career development, pay and benefits, pro bono engagement, and work-life balance, and will shed light on the unique career challenges the Chinese American lawyers face today and the impact on cross-border legal work by the geopolitical tensions between the US and China.

Speaker: Prof. Ji Li, UC Irvine law school

Professor Li joined UCI Law in 2019 as the John S. and Marilyn Long Professor of U.S.-China Business and Law. Previously, he was a Professor of Law and Zhuang Zhou Scholar at Rutgers University. He holds a Ph.D. in political science from Northwestern University and a J.D. from Yale Law School, where he was an Olin Fellow. He also practiced at Sullivan & Cromwell LLP in New York. His teaching and research focus on Chinese law and politics, international business transactions, and comparative law. He has authored Negotiating Legality (2024) and Clash of Capitalisms (2018), analyzing how Chinese multinationals navigate U.S. legal systems. A former fellow at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, he is currently working on books exploring China's interactions with the international legal order and the U.S.-China geopolitical rivalry.

KEYTOPICS

Course summary: Because of the high tariffs enacted by the US government, a growing number of Chinese firms are moving their production to the US. Angus Ni

Associate Justice Goodwin H. Liu

Goodwin Liu is an Associate Justice of the California Supreme Court. Nominated by Governor Jerry Brown, Justice Liu was sworn into office in 2011 and retained by the electorate in 2014 and 2022. Before joining the state's highest court, Justice Liu was Professor of Law and Associate Dean at the UC Berkeley School of Law. His primary areas of expertise are constitutional law, education law and policy, and diversity in the legal profession. Justice Liu continues to teach constitutional law as a visiting professor at Harvard Law School, Columbia Law School, and Stanford Law School. He is an elected member and chair of the board of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences. He is also an elected member of the American Law Institute, and the American Philosophical Society. In 2023, he was elected Chair of the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences. He also serves on the Council of the American Law Institute, on the Board of Directors of the James Irvine Foundation, and as President of the Yale University Council. He has previously served on the Board of Trustees of Stanford University, the National Academy of Sciences Committee on Science, Technology, and Law, the Board of Directors of the National Women's Law Center, and the California Commission on Access to Justice.

The son of Taiwanese immigrants, Justice Liu grew up in Sacramento and attended public schools. He earned a bachelor's degree in biology from Stanford, a masters degree in philosophy and physiology from Oxford University on a Rhodes Scholarship, and a law degree from Yale. He clerked for Judge David Tatel on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and for Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg on the U.S. Supreme Court. He has also worked in the litigation practice of O'Melveny & Myers, served as Special Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education, and helped launch the AmeriCorps national service program as Senior Program Officer for Higher Education at the Corporation for National Service.
