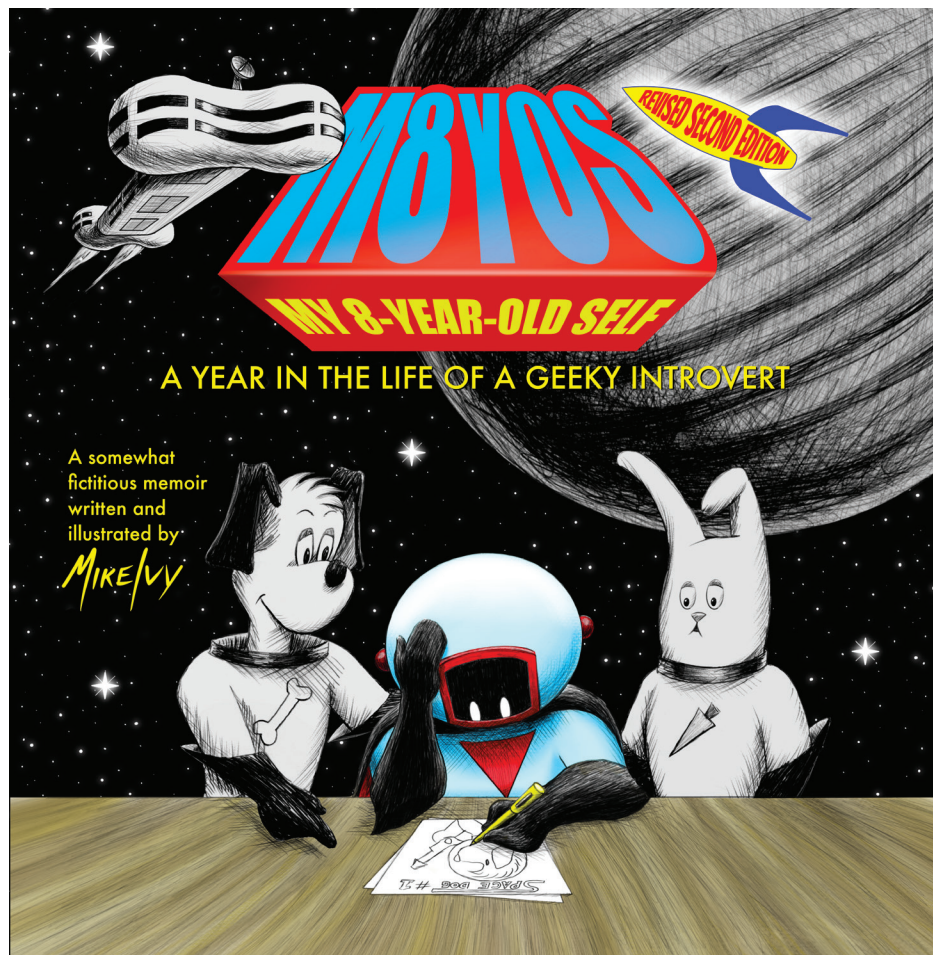

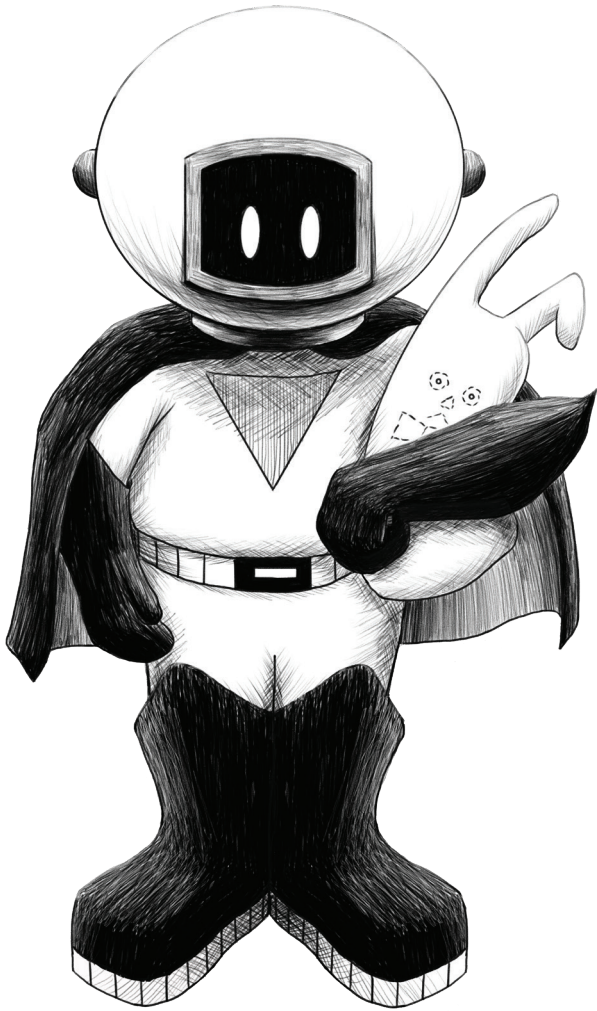
A Year in the Life of a Geeky Introvert

Mike Ivy's *My 8-Year-Old Self* is a whimsical, semi-autobiographical graphic memoir of imagination and introversion. The main character — Ivy's perpetual 8-year-old inner child — wears a space suit (because it looks cool) and uses creativity and imagination to navigate the awkwardness of everyday life. His constant companion is Bunny, a handmade rag-doll rabbit.

Fueled by a love of *Star Wars* and *Snoopy*, he draws comic books about the interstellar adventures of Space Dog and Bunny, and often joins them in his own fantasy escapades. Over the course of a year filled with mischief, mishaps, and imagination, *My 8-Year-Old Self* dreams of creating the most epic comic book in the universe.

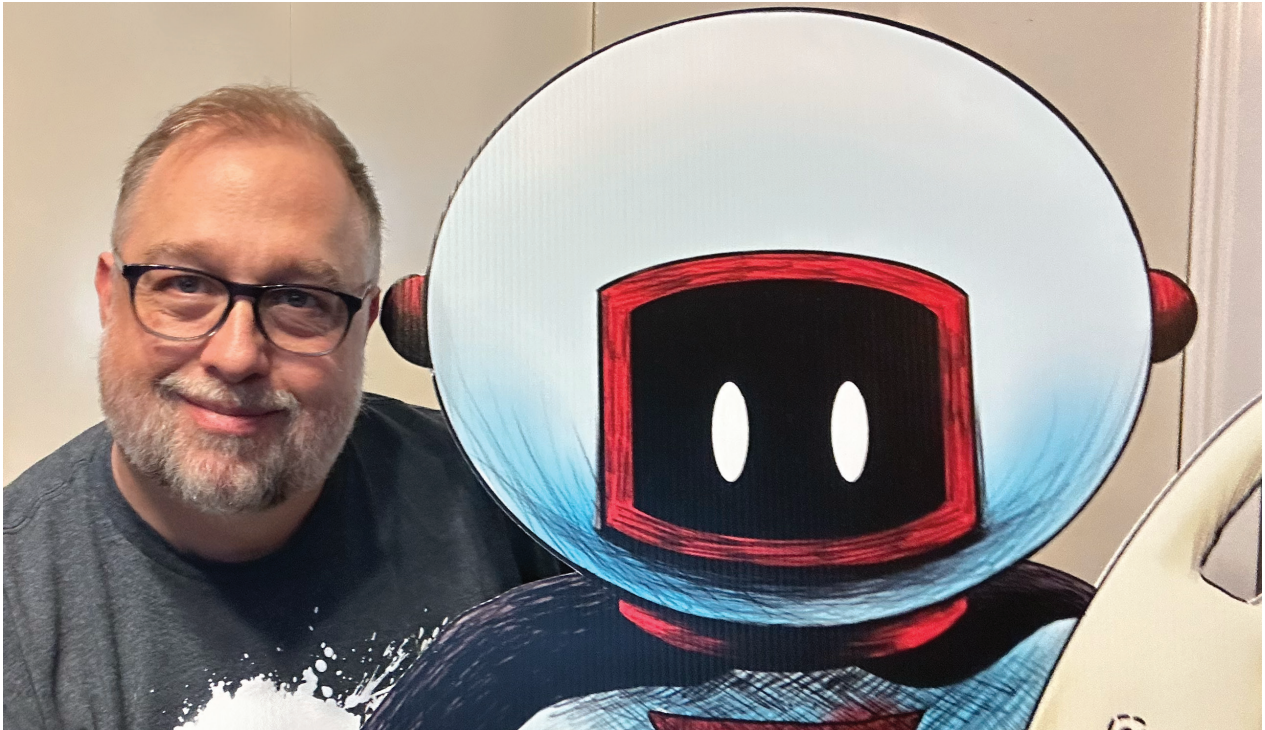

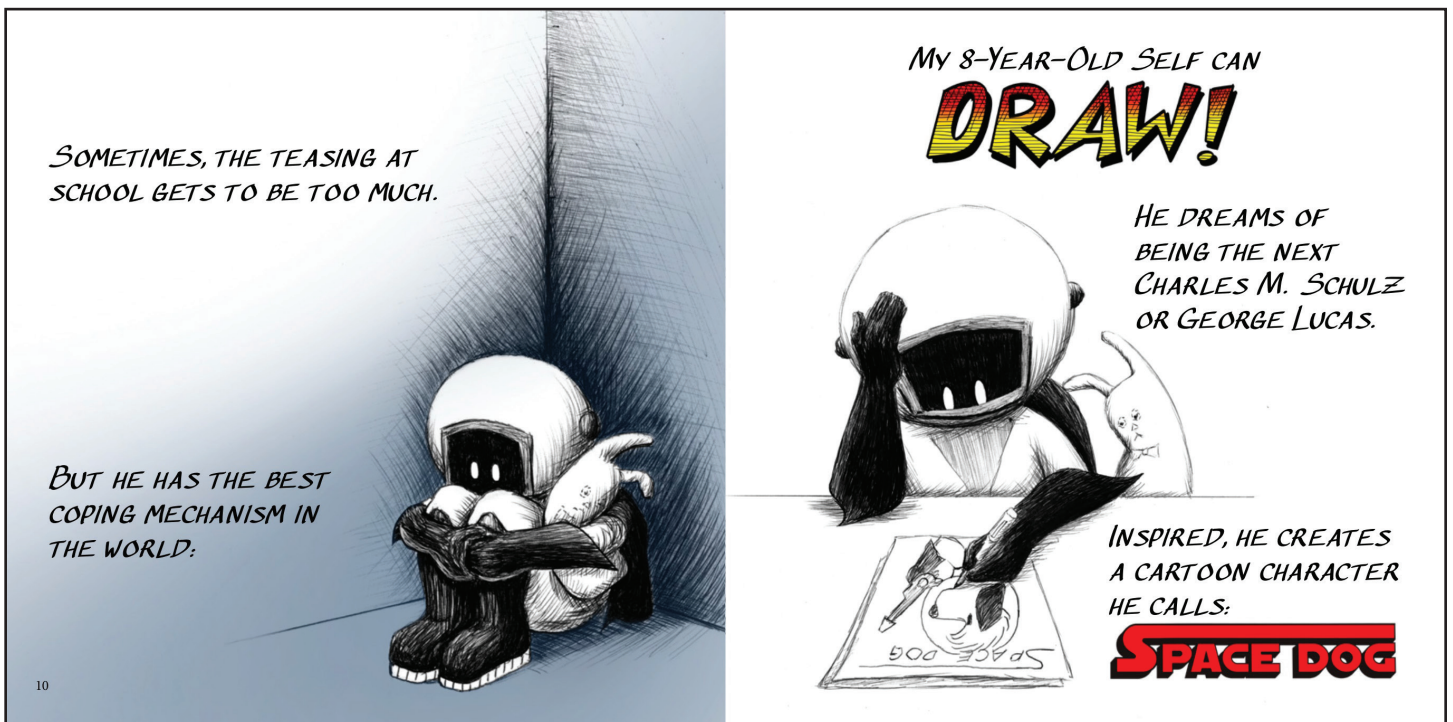
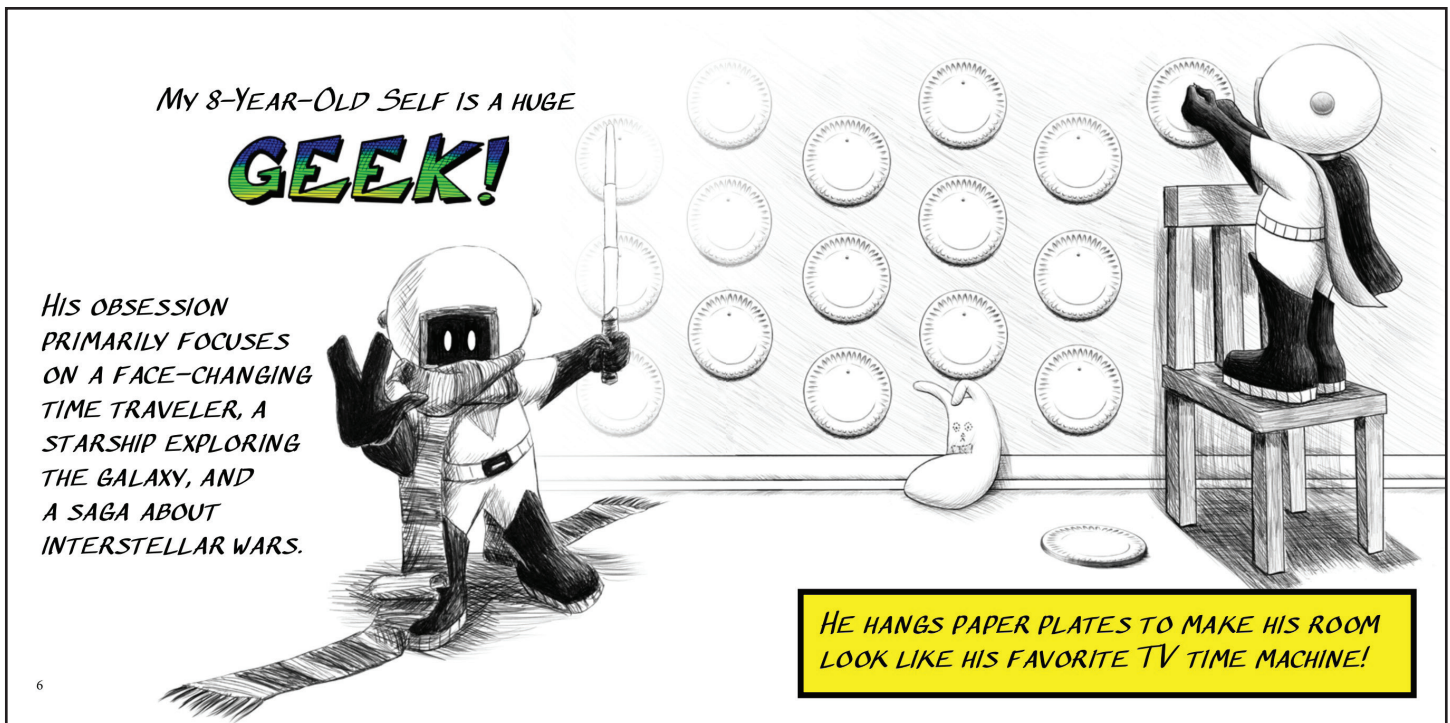
### Formal Biography:

Born and raised in Austin, Texas, Mike Ivy was an Art teacher for 25 years. Drawing has been his passion since early childhood. Teaching Art allowed him to continue growing and developing as an artist himself, inspired by the many artists he introduced to his students, especially Edward Gorey and Charles M. Schulz. He still lives in the Austin area along with his husband and two very spoiled dogs, and is currently working on the second book in the series, "The Sophomore Slump." ### Casual Biography:

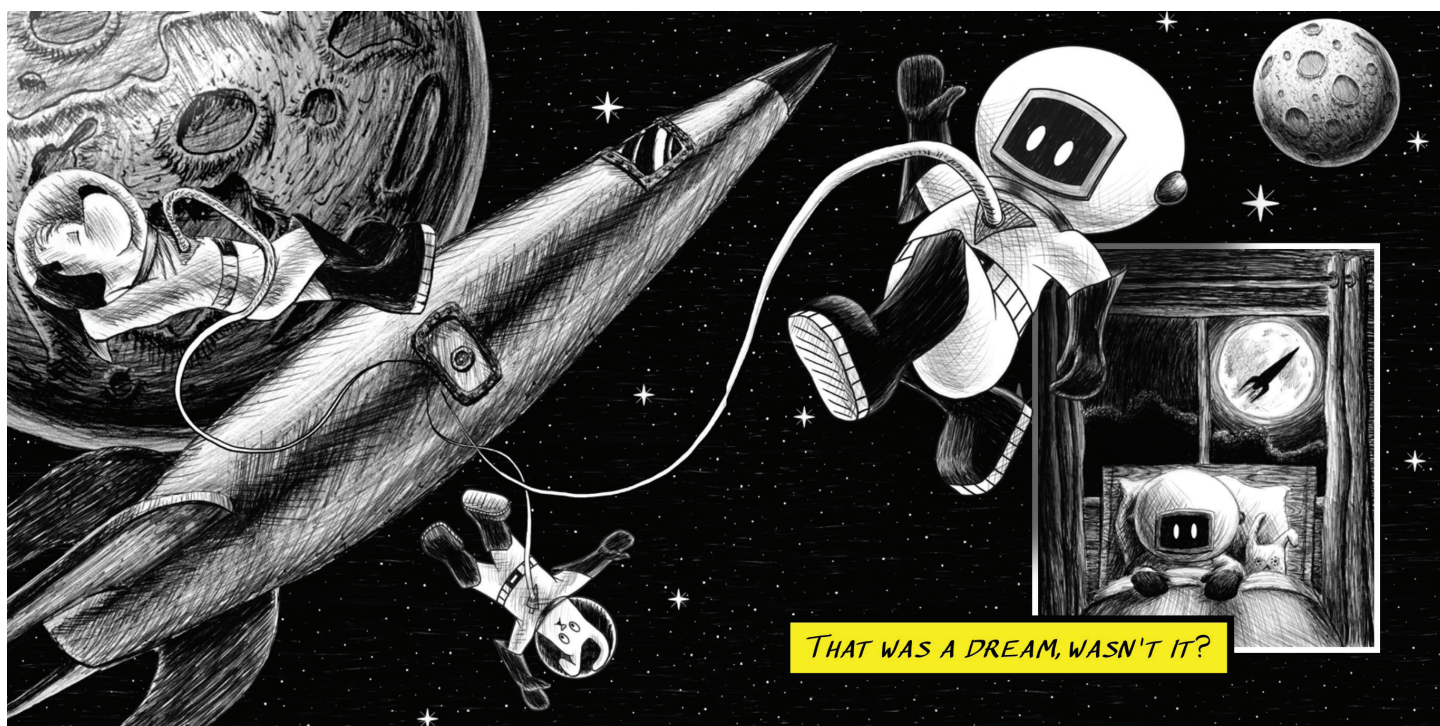
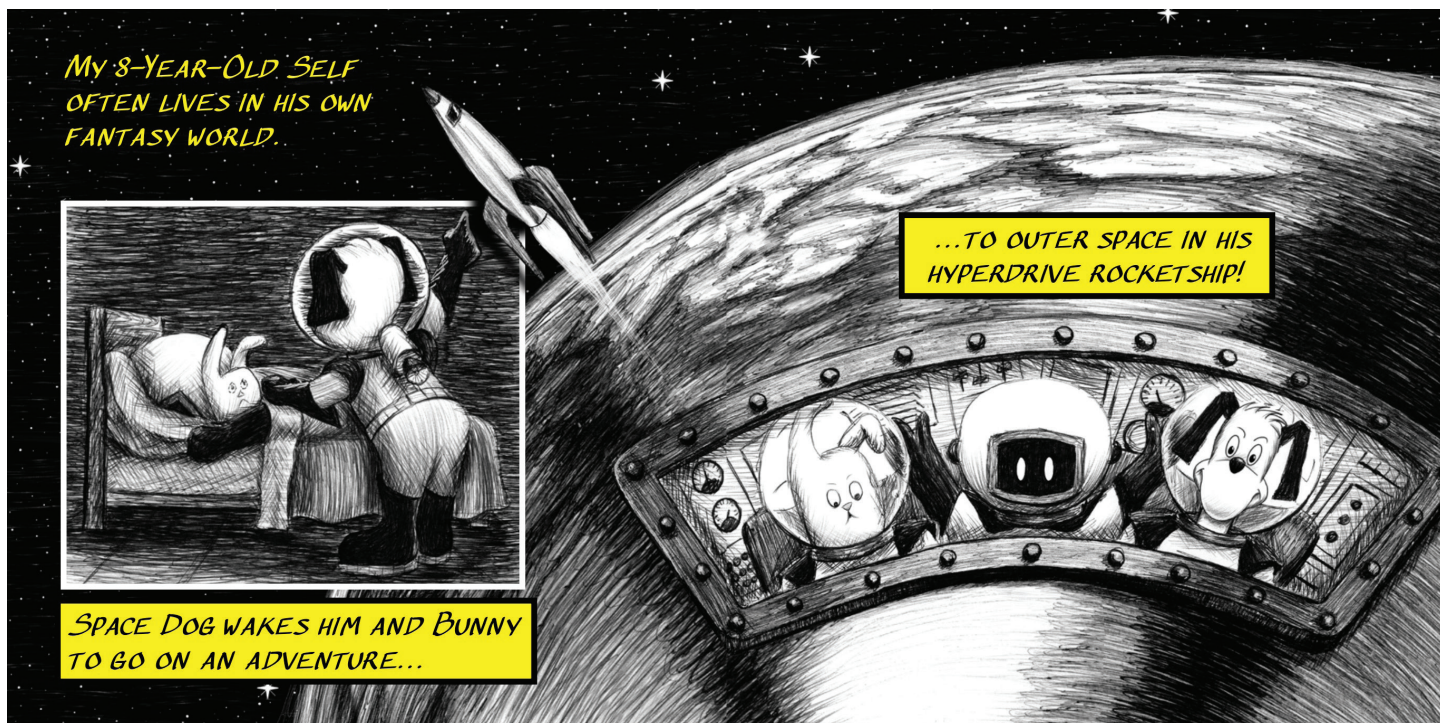
I am an Austin-based artist and former art teacher spending 25 years inspiring young creators in Pflugerville ISD. A lifelong doodler, I started drawing my character, Space Dog, after seeing *Star Wars* in 1977 and quickly became a one-boy comic book empire, full of hubris, with an audience of one. Influenced by Charles M. Schulz and Edward Gorey, I eventually created *My 8-Year-Old Self*—a storybook-style graphic memoir that brings together my childhood imagination, teaching experience, and love of drawing. Today, I've come full circle, still sketching Space Dog's adventures while keeping the hubris (mostly) in check.
