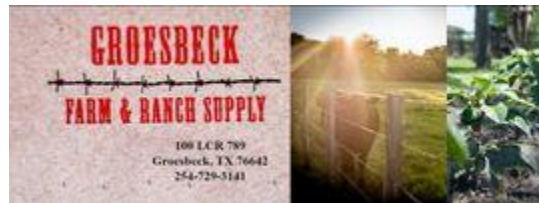

LIMESTONE COUNTY FAIR & YOUTH LIVESTOCK SHOW 2019-2020

** Indicates new or revised rule

GENERAL RULES

1. Each family represented in the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show is required to pay a \$10.00 yearly family membership fee or **\$100.00 lifetime membership**. This is your contribution to help create and improve our show activities.
2. **The Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show reserves to its Board of Directors the final right to interpret these rules and questions and differences in regard to or otherwise arising out of or connect with or incident to the show, and the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgement may determine. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than seven and no more than 15 members from the county.**
3. **Any false representation, interference, unethical conduct or violation of any of the following rules will result in a forfeit of all privileges and premiums and be barred from showing in the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show. Reinstatement of this privilege shall come by the decision of the Board of Directors. The use of drugs, stimulants, or alcohol will be banned from use on the show grounds.**
4. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted nor suit instituted or maintained against the Limestone County Fair Association, its officers or agents by or on behalf of any persons exhibiting at the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show. The Limestone County Fair Association shall not be held responsible for any injury or damage to property or persons attending or exhibiting at the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show.
5. **JUNIOR (3rd-7th) & SENIOR (8th-12th) EXHIBITORS MUST BE A 4-H OR FFA MEMBER. PEE-WEE (K-2nd) EXHIBITORS HAVE TO BE INVOLVED IN 4-H OR FFA AND ATTEND THREE (3) MEETINGS.** Pee-Wee (K-2nd) are eligible to show and will be supervised by a designated Superintendent. ALL exhibitors must permanently reside in Limestone County and/or be enrolled in a Limestone County school, grades K-12. 4-H & FFA membership must be achieved by 10/18/19. Limestone County Fair Association will allow a 2-week grace period with an ending date of 11/01/2019. **Members must be in good standing by attending at least 3 meetings or sanctioned events in their enrolled chapter, prior to the 2020 Fair. Verification will be by official sign-in sheet.**
6. All exhibitors must own and exhibit their animal. Substitution of showmen are allowed only for exhibitors having 2 or more animals in the same class or with a notarized doctor's excuse. The Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show will enforce no pass-no play rule during the show. If the student is eligible to show, he will be eligible to sell. It is the responsibility of the schools or Agricultural Science Teachers to check grades. There will be no substitutions of showmen for failing students. Substitutions are also permitted with excused school functions or UIL events, with Board approval.

7. Exhibitors may validate as many projects as they desire to own and care for, but may only show 2 animals per division. (Refer to General Rule #14).
8. Exhibitors will fill out an application on each animal. The Fair Association will handle all applications for the show from all exhibitors on all animals. Entry fees collected must be turned into the Fair Association by an Extension Agent or Ag. Science Teacher. All exhibitors' entry information must be verified by an Agriculture Science Teacher, Extension Agent, parent or guardian. Entry fee and final entry date will be the current dates as set by the Fair Association. (See dates at end of rules). No entry will be accepted unless it is accompanied by the entry fee, signed by a teacher or agent **and** parent or guardian and **completely filled out**.
9. Market and breeding animals can be validated by family name instead of individual exhibitor's name. **All eligible exhibitors in the family must be listed on the entry card at time of validation with primary exhibitor listed first; The exhibitor must declare the animals they will show at the time of check-in.**
10. All projects must be owned, in the possession of the exhibitor and fed by the exhibitor during the feeding period. No other individual will care for the animal during the feeding period.
11. **No entry fees will be refunded.**
12. Any and all protests must be made in writing to the Superintendent within one (1) hour of incident and a deposit of \$100.00 (cash) must be made which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained.
13. Exhibitors must furnish feed, care for and keep animals in a presentable condition while on the show grounds – any violations will be subject to board review.
14. Divisions of the Fair will be as follows:

Market Division

- A. Market Steers
- B. Pen of 2
- C. Market Swine
- D. Market Lambs
- E. Market Goats
- F. Market Rabbits
- G. Market Broilers
- H. Market Turkeys
- I. Family & Consumer Health
- J. Ag Mechanics

Breeding Division

- A. Halter Heifers
- B. Breeding Rabbits
- C. Breeding Swine
- D. Breeding Lambs
- E. Breeding Goats
- F. Horses (Mares & Geldings)

15. A “**class**” is defined as one of two or more groupings derived from a division as the division is broken down into smaller more manageable or judgeable units. A class will be formed into units based on factors such as: number of projects, weight, and age. Classes will be broken by the Fair Board at natural weight breaks.
16. Ribbons and Trophies will be awarded at the time of showing. Prize money will be awarded following the show.
17. Superintendents of each division will have full and complete charge of all livestock in their respective division. Each Superintendent will be responsible for their division at validation and show including help, arrangements, setup, and delivery of animals in their divisions.
18. The Superintendent, and at least 2 designated assistants, will be present in the ring during the show. **NO OTHER INDIVIDUAL** will be allowed to enter the ring once the exhibitor steps through the show gate. Disqualification of the exhibitor will be at the discretion of the board.
19. Any animal standing in a class by itself will be moved to the closest class fitting its qualifications at the discretion of the show officials.
20. If less than 3 entries per class, no higher than 2nd place money will be given.
21. Animals must be trained to lead and/or show. Proof of demonstration will be required at check-in/weigh-in by the exhibitor, or another eligible exhibitor, Ag Teacher, Extension Agent. **NO PARENTS** (i.e., demonstration of showmanship), with the exception of the Pen of 2. See General Rule #14. **UNRULY ANIMALS WILL BE DISMISSED FROM THE SHOW GROUNDS BY THE SUPERINTENDENT.** Disqualified animals must also be removed from the show grounds.
22. There will be no breeding of livestock on the show grounds.
23. ****When grooming all livestock, no foreign color shall be added to the hair coat.**
24. **ALL ANIMALS MUST BE CLIPPED PRIOR TO ARRIVAL ON SHOW GROUNDS. CLIPPERS WILL BE ALLOWED FOR CLEANUP ONLY.**
25. All animals must meet requirements concerning health as set forth by the Texas Animal Health Commission.
26. All projects shall be in place by the time designated by the rules under the appropriate division. If said projects are not in its appropriate place by third call, it and its owner will be disqualified.
27. All students who are planning to exhibit livestock in the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show will notify the Agricultural teachers or County Agent upon receiving their project.
28. All exhibitors are requested to dress appropriately for the show. The dress of the exhibitor will affect showmanship.

29. If an exhibitor shows two animals in the same class, the person showing the second animal must be an eligible exhibitor. If entered under the family rule, then another eligible exhibitor in the family must show that animal.
30. All market animals will be weighed one time only during weigh-in. If the Superintendent or exhibitor has a question regarding the weight, the animal can be taken off the scale, scale can be re-balanced, and animal **re-weighed immediately**.
31. If bedding is used on the grounds, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to remove bedding/trash after the show. Failure to remove bedding/trash from the assigned stall will cause a \$25.00 cleanup bill to be charged. Pens will be assigned and \$25.00 will be deducted from the sale proceeds. Each Livestock Superintendent will inspect their pens after the show.
32. There will be a Breeding Swine, Breeding Ewe, Breeding Goat and/or Breeding Rabbit Show **ONLY** if there is a minimum of 5 entries.
33. Projects will be washed in designated washing areas **ONLY**. Prior to classifications all animals must be cleaned.

- If an exhibitor purchases a project, it is the responsibility of that exhibitor or guardian to find out the deadline date for validation. Regular validation fees will be charged for animals validated on or before the deadline dates. Advisors, such as the County Extension Agent, located in the basement of the County Courthouse, or the Vocational Agriculture Teachers at most High Schools in the County, will provide this information.
- The LCFA will attempt to publicize the dates as they approach, but the LCFA has no way of knowing who has purchased a project; therefore, it will be impossible for the LCFA to contact every person involved.
- A two-week grace period will follow each validation date. During that two week period, any animal not validated may be validated. If you validate during that two-week grace period, the late validation fee will be \$50.00 per animal. Three day grace period on rabbits.
- **If you do not have the animal validated by the end of the two-week grace period, the animal will not be allowed to show in the fair. There will be no exceptions.**

SALE RULES

1. An exhibitor may sell a maximum of two projects in any one year, but they must be from two different divisions.
2. The project and animal classes eligible for the sale are: Market Steers, Market Goats, Market Sheep, Market Swine, Market Turkeys, Market Broilers, Market Rabbits, Pen of 2, Ag Mechanics, and some high placing Family & Community Health projects. Of these, only the following will be given a floor price: Market Steers, Market Goats, Market Sheep, Market Swine and Pen-of-2.
3. **Once the buyer of the floor has been designated, LCFA will no longer be responsible for the animal.**
4. All sale items' pictures (one copy) and plaque will be paid for by the exhibitor, at a cost not to exceed \$20.00, and will be deducted from check. This picture and plaque will be given to the buyer. Any additional pictures will be paid for by the exhibitor and paid in advance of ordering.
5. **No commission** fee will be placed on sale items.
6. If a person has two animals of the same division to qualify for the sale, it is at the discretion of the exhibitor as to which animal will be sold, but will still be in placing order for the sale.
7. Additional rules may be stated prior to the sale by the announcer concerning the terms of the sale.
8. The project must be brought to the sale holding pen by the exhibitor and/or parent. If not, the project will be skipped and not sold until end of the sale.

9. The student will place the animal in designated pen after the animal is sold. Do not remove any sold animals from the show grounds unless instructed by the Superintendent.
10. If you have an animal you wish to floor that did not make the sale, you must obtain a "Floor Form" from the Fair office by 9:00 a.m. Saturday of sale.
11. If you have a project or animal that does not fall under the above two categories, you must remove that project from the Show Barn Area by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, after the show, with approval from the Superintendent.
12. Thank you notes will be hand written to project buyers, put in a stamped envelope and **turned in to the Extension Office or Ag Science teacher before check will be distributed**. If check is not picked up and cashed within 90 days, the check will be voided and money placed in the Scholarship Fund.
13. The Limestone County Fair Youth Project Sale Order will be determined by the Fair Board before start of show. Sale order will be determined by class placing beginning with the highest placing animal. Sale numbers will be posted before the show after check-in.
14. All Grand and Reserve Champion **animal projects** must sell. (Sale Rules #5 & #7 will take precedence if an exhibitor has more than 2 champions).
15. Projects in the sale or being floored will be the responsibility of the exhibitor. Unclaimed projects will be floored and the money will be placed in the LCFA Scholarship Fund.
16. Once an animal has been sold in the Youth Project Sale, it is ineligible for entry into any future LCFA Youth Livestock Show.
17. There must be a minimum of 5 entries to make a class.
18. ****All non-floor projects including poultry and rabbits, must bring a gift basket in lieu of animal to sale ring.**
19. **Number of sale lots will be determined by LCFA Board of Directors.**

SHOWMANSHIP

1. All exhibitors are eligible to compete for these awards:
 - A. Haltered Cattle
 - B. Swine (Market)
 - C. Sheep (Market)
 - D. Goats (Market)
 - E. Horses

2. Classes will be divided into three age groups: Pee-Wee (K-2nd Grades); Juniors (3rd-5th Grades); Intermediate (6th -8th Grades); Seniors (9th-12th Grades), on day of check-in.

3. All exhibitors are requested to dress appropriately for the show. Dress of the exhibitor will affect showmanship.

MARKET STEERS

1. A 3 man committee will be appointed by the Limestone County Fair Association to oversee the steer show.
2. All steers will be validated on 10/19/19, preceding the show in that current school year.
3. Steers cannot weigh less than 300 pounds with no grace on the day of validation.
4. The gain contest starts the day of validation.
5. Steers will be weighed only once the day of validation (See General Rule #30).
6. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1000 pounds, with a 5 pound grace, upon weigh-in at the show.
7. All steers will be tagged with an ear tag on the day of validation.
8. Each exhibitor may validate as many steers as wanted, but may only show two steers and sell only the top placing steer, if both make the sale. Fees will be charged at validation per animal.
9. Steers will be divided into weight classes as determined by the steer committee and each class will not exceed 10 head per class.
10. Steers must be dehorned.
11. Animals that are sifted or disqualified must be removed from the show grounds immediately.
12. No change of the major color pattern of the animal by painting or dying will be allowed.
13. Any grooming material that allows color to come off will not be allowed.
14. All steers shall be clipped to have no more than 1/4 (one fourth) inch of hair on any part of its body upon arrival to the show grounds. The only exception will be the tail switch. Steers will be checked at the time of weigh-in for conformity of the quarter inch of hair or less. All steers found in violation of this rule will be eliminated from competition and removed from the grounds.

HALTERED HEIFERS

1. Haltered heifers will be divided into two divisions, Exotic or British and American, according to the amount of entries entered into the show. The Haltered Heifer Committee will divide the divisions.
2. Animals will be divided into classes by age according to major show rules. Heifers must be born 09/01/17 and after.
3. All exhibitors must meet all requirements as set forth in the general rules of the show.
4. Haltered heifers will be validated on 01/11/20.
5. Haltered heifers must show breed registration papers at validation except non-registered heifers.
6. Haltered heifers must **show proof of bangs vaccination at time of validation.**
7. Clipping of heifers on the show grounds will be allowed for clean-up only.
8. All haltered heifers must be dehorned at time of show.
9. The Fair Board will consider paying premiums on the heifers, depending on number of entries per class.
10. Heifers must be shown in natural state.
11. Any additional rules will be left to the committee in charge.
12. Haltered heifers are released upon completion of Heifer Show.
13. There will be one overall Grand Champion and one overall Reserve Champion.

PEN OF 2 COMMERCIAL HEIFERS

Initial Validation:

1. 10/19/19
2. Exhibitor must bring heifers to validation.
3. Exhibitor may validate a minimum of 2 heifers and a maximum of 5 heifers.

2nd Validation:

1. 3/07/20
2. Exhibitor must bring heifers to validation.
3. Heifers must be palpated OPEN by a vet determined by the Fair no more than 30 days prior to show. A copy of vet certificate must be provided at check-in.
4. Heifers will be pregnancy and teeth-checked by a vet provided by LCFA. 2 year incisors cannot be showing.
5. Heifers must be vaccinated with Bangs, Lepto, Vibrio, IBR, 7 Way Black Leg. Vet verification must be present in record book or heifers will be disqualified.

Rules:

1. Heifers must be a **beef type breed**.
2. Heifers must be **14-24 months old at time of show**.
3. Heifers must be vaccinated with Bangs, Lepto, Vibrio, IBR, 7 Way Black Leg. Vet verification must be present in record book or heifers will be disqualified.
4. ONLY head-clipping 30 days prior to show.
5. Each heifer must be polled or de-horned by **initial validation**.
6. Classes **may** be broken into Pee-Wee, Junior and Senior divisions (depending on number of entries and grades of exhibitors). Pee-Wee (K-2nd Grades); Juniors (3rd-7th Grades); Seniors (8th-12th), on day of check-in.
7. Cattle:
 - a. Cattle will be judged by a minimum of 2 judges.
 - b. Cattle judges will judge the heifers independently and will not be allowed to discuss their opinions with each other.
 - c. Characteristics that the cattle will be judged on will include, but not necessarily limited to: how well the pair are matched; overall quality; structural correctness; maternal characteristics; marketability; performance.

- d. The judge's scores will be averaged to determine final placing for the cattle component of the competition.
 - e. All other tags must be removed by time of show.
8. Interview:
- a. Interview will consist of management questions about the heifers and general record book questions.
 - b. Characteristics that the interviews will be judged on will include, but not necessarily limited to: general knowledge; knowledge of the record book; justification of management decisions; presentation.
9. Record Book:
- a. A suggested template for the record book will be provided to the exhibitors at the **Pen of 2 meeting after validation**.
 - b. Record books should include, at a minimum: input costs; break even costs; vet records; feed records; monthly detailed expense reports (October – March); monthly consumption records and must be typed.
 - c. Record books should include at least 10 pictures documenting the heifers throughout the management period. The following pictures are required:
 - i. At least one picture of the initial heifer group (must include all heifers validated).
 - ii. At least one “final” picture of the two heifers selected for judging.
10. Point System & Component Percentages:
- a. Each component (Cattle, Interview and Record Book) will be worth 10 points.
 - b. First place for each component will receive 10 points, second will receive 9 points, etc.
 - c. Components will be weighed with the following percentages:
 - i. Cattle 50%
 - ii. Interview 25%
 - iii. Record Book 25%

Sale of Heifers:

1. Exhibitors are responsible to have heifers at the sale on time.
2. **All exhibitors must be present at the sale or charged a \$100 fee per head.**

BREEDING SWINE

1. Breeding swine may be shown in market class. This determination must be made at validation and fees paid accordingly.
2. Any additional rules will be left to the committee in charge.

MARKET SWINE

1. All market swine must be on feed by the exhibitor and validated and ear-tagged on 01/11/20 preceding the show in the current school year.
2. Gilts may be shown in the market class.
3. Market swine will be weighed prior to the show.
4. Swine will be divided into the following breed divisions: Yorkshire, Hampshire, Duroc, Cross & Other Pure Breeds (OPB). Classes will then be set by weight. This will be done only with the weights on the day of the show.
5. All swine must be clipped prior to arrival on the show grounds.
6. All market swine must weigh 220 pounds (with a 5 pound grace) or they will be disqualified. Floor will pay up to 280lbs.
7. **All animals must be clean prior to weighing and classification including validation tag.**
8. Remove all tags except major validation tags prior to validation date.

BREEDING EWES

1. Breeding ewes may be shown in market class. This determination must be made at validation and fees paid accordingly.
2. All socks and blankets must be removed prior to crossing scales.
3. Remove all tags, except major validation tags, prior to validation date.
4. Any additional rules will be left to the committee in charge.

MARKET LAMBS

1. Lambs must be on feed by the exhibitor and validated and ear-tagged on 01/11/20 preceding the show that current year.
2. Lambs will be weighed and divided into weight classes as determined by the superintendent.
3. All lambs must weigh at least 90 pounds (with a 5 pound grace) or they will be disqualified.
4. Ewe lambs may be shown as market lambs.
5. All lambs must be slick shorn from the hocks up upon arrival to the show grounds.
6. Lambs will be required to have all baby teeth at validation.
7. All socks and blankets must be removed prior to crossing scales.
8. Remove all tags, except major validation tags, prior to validation date.

BREEDING GOATS

1. All breeding goats will be clean and groomed.
2. Breeding goats may be shown in market class. This determination must be made at validation and fees paid accordingly.
3. Breeding goats cannot have more than 6 adult teeth at validation.
4. **Horns must be blunt (dime size - no pointed horns).**
5. Remove all tags, except major tags, prior to validation date.
6. Any additional rules will be left to the committee in charge.

MARKET GOATS

1. The Goat show is open to any breed or crossbreed meat type goat.
2. Goats must be on feed by the exhibitor and validated and ear-tagged on 01/11/20 preceding the show that current year.
3. Only castrated males or un-bred does will be allowed to show.
4. **All goats must be dehorned.**
5. Minimum weight of 65 pounds, maximum 120 pounds, with a 5 pound tolerance.
6. All socks and blankets must be removed before crossing the scales.
7. Remove all tags, except major tags, prior to validation date.
8. Goats will be divided into classes by weight. Number of classes will be determined by the superintendent.
9. Goats will be required to have all baby teeth at validation.
10. Goats must be slick shorn, except the tip of tail and below knees and hocks, upon arrival to the show grounds.

BREEDING RABBITS

1. Exhibitor must own and bring rabbit(s) on validation date.
2. Each exhibitor can validate only 3 rabbits.
3. **RABBITS MUST HAVE CLEAN EARS.**
4. The classes of rabbits are: 1) Breeding Bucks; 2) Breeding Does
5. Exhibitor must handle and show their own rabbits.
6. **NO BREEDING will be allowed.**
7. All breeding rabbits shall leave grounds at completion of Breeding Show.
8. Any additional rules will be left to the committee in charge.

MARKET RABBITS

1. Fryer rabbits must be six to twelve weeks of age at the time of show.
2. Exhibitors can validate up to five rabbits per pen, but only three per pen can be checked in.
3. Fryers will be shown in pens of three with each pen being uniform in size and breed.
4. Exhibitors may show two (2) pens of fryers but sell only one.
5. **RABBITS MUST HAVE CLEAN EARS.**
6. Rabbit projects must be owned by the exhibitor and validated on 03/07/20 preceding the show that current year.
7. Rabbits must be brought to validation where they will be tattooed. Entry cards and fees are due at this time.
8. Fryer rabbits shall weigh a minimum of 3 pounds and not more than 5 pounds the day of the show when weighed in.
9. **Pens must be set before coming to official weigh-in.**
10. **No re-weigh of rabbits.**
11. ****All rabbits shall leave grounds at completion of Market Show.**
12. ****Per SALE RULES (pg. 7, #18): All non-floor projects including poultry and rabbits, must bring a gift basket in lieu of animal to sale ring.**

MARKET TURKEYS

1. Turkeys must be from a certified pullorum-free hatchery and will come from the same hatch.
2. All participants are eligible to enter hens **only**.
3. Each exhibitor must order at least five poults. Exhibitor's name will be turned into Superintendent.
4. **Payment is due when turkey order is placed.**
5. Turkeys will be validated upon pick-up.
6. Turkeys will be from 5 to 6 months old at time of show.
7. Verification of entry will be received by the poultry superintendent at the time of delivery.
8. Turkeys will be shown in pens of one. A total of 2 pens may be shown by the exhibitor.
9. **TURKEYS MUST BE CLEAN AT TIME OF SHOW.**
10. Exhibitor is required to label each pen at check-in.
11. ****All turkeys shall leave grounds at completion of Market Show.**
12. ****Per SALE RULES (pg. 7, #18): All non-floor projects including poultry and rabbits, must bring a gift basket in lieu of animal to sale ring.**

MARKET BROILERS

1. Broilers must be from a certified pullorum-free hatchery.
2. Broilers will come from the same hatch and will be wing-banded. Broilers will be ordered by the Superintendent.
3. Each exhibitor must order at least 25 chicks. Exhibitor's name will be turned in to the Superintendent.
4. **Payment is due when broiler order is placed.**
5. Broilers will be validated upon pick-up.
6. Broilers will be from six to eight weeks old at time of show.
7. Broilers will be shown in pens of three **AND MUST BE CLEAN AT TIME OF THE SHOW**. A total of 2 pens may be shown by the exhibitor.
8. ****Pens must be set before coming to official weigh – in.**
9. ****No re-weigh of broilers.**
10. Broilers will be divided into 2 classes: Pullets & Cockerels.
11. Broilers shall weigh a minimum of 5 pounds day of the show when weighed in.
12. First and Second place pens from both divisions are eligible for Grand & Reserve placing.
13. Exhibitor is required to label each pen at check-in.
14. ****All broilers shall leave grounds at completion of Market Show.**
15. ****Per SALE RULES (pg. 7, #18): All non-floor projects including poultry and rabbits, must bring a gift basket in lieu of animal to sale ring.**

****OPPORTUNITY FUND****

Application Rules:

1. Any boy or girl who has reached his or her 8th Grade by or at the time of application, and has not exceeded his or her Junior Year in High School, may eligible for the 2020 Limestone County Opportunity Fund.
2. *Opportunity Fund Application* must be filled out completely and properly signed by parents, applicant, and County Extension Agent (CEA) or FFA Advisor. Applications can be found through your Limestone County Extension agent or FFA Advisor. **Entries must be turned in by January 31, 2020.**
3. Applicants will be required to write a 250 word minimum essay along with application.

Duties & Responsibilities:

1. One applicant per school district will be chosen.
2. Certificates must be used for the purchase of a haltered heifer, Pen of 2, market steer, swine, goat or lamb. Haltered heifers may be purchased from ANY breeder. Opportunity Fund animals will be the contestant's 4-H/FFA project in the 2020/2021 Limestone County Fair and Youth Livestock Show.
3. The entire program, including the selection of the kind of breed of livestock, the care and management, will be under the supervision of the CEA or Ag-Science Teacher.
4. The certificate must be signed by the breeder from whom the project is purchased before payment will be made.
5. Winner will need to provide adequate stalling and pasturing for the project.
6. Winner will assume all cost involved in maintaining a healthy livestock project (i.e. feed, vaccinations).
7. Under no circumstances will a contestant showing a calf, swine, goat or lamb be allowed to sell, trade or dispose of the animal until after it has been shown at the 2021 Fair and is removed from the premises.
8. Winners will be required to maintain records on this project and report monthly results to the Limestone County Fair Association Board.
9. Winners will be required to produce all expense receipts up to \$1000.

2019/2020 LIMESTONE COUNTY FAIR KING AND QUEEN'S COURT CONTEST

The purpose of the LCFA King and Queen's Contest is to select young gentlemen and ladies who can best represent the youth of Limestone County. Guidelines and dates are subject to change as the Fair Board sees fit.

Competition Categories K-12th:

- Fair King and Queen must be in grades 9th – 12th.
- Junior Mister and Miss must be in grades 6th – 8th.
- Lil' Junior Mister and Miss must be in grades 3rd – 5th.
- Lil' Mister and Miss must be in grades K – 2nd.

General Contestant Rules: Contestants must meet the following criteria to compete in the contest. Failure to do so will result in the contestant being disqualified and no longer able to participate.

All Contestants Must:

- * Live in Limestone County and/or enrolled in the Limestone County School District.
- * Be academically qualified according to U.I.L. regulations.
- * Have at least one division entry in the LCFA Show. (Livestock and/or Family and Community Health).
- * Be enrolled in the FFA Chapter or 4-H Club on or before November 1, 2018.
- * Will be required to attend the dinner and coronation, with proper western dress attire (boots, belt, and hat).
- * Be held accountable for your social media actions and can be dismissed from the contest at the boards' discretion.
- * Will be required to sell 10, \$20 dinner tickets and 75, \$10 raffle tickets.
**Dinner and raffle tickets are 10% of the contest. Instead of receiving bonus points for extra tickets sold. We will be awarding a \$100 visa gift card per division for the contestant that sales the most overall tickets.
- * Will be required to bring three desserts for dinner.
- * Will be required to bring a minimal of three auction items no less than \$25 each with no max. Auction items may be turned in before or on the day of coronation.

* Will be required to write an essay – lengths are different for each division and the topic will be **“What does the fair mean to your community?”**

* Will be required to present a PowerPoint presentation to judges on announced date. Topic will be **“What does LCFA mean to you?”**

* Each contestant will be required to complete a personal interview consisting of three questions asked by the judges. The questions will be based on the contestant’s age division.

Rules for each division as follows:

Fair King and Queen:

1. To qualify to participate in the Queen’s Contest, you must sell dinner and raffle tickets determined by the King/Queen’s Committee. If you start to sell tickets and do not turn in your tickets when they are due, you will be dismissed from the Contest and will not be allowed to run the following year.
2. You must run at least one year during high school prior to your senior year to receive scholarships.
3. Contestants must be single. If he/she becomes married or pregnant during the contest or time of his/her reign as king/queen, princess, or duchess, he/she must relinquish his/her title and all that encompass. The next person in line will become eligible for that spot.
4. You must attend fair and other activities within the county during your reign of king/queen, princess and duchess.
5. You will write a minimum of 750 and maximum of 1,000 word essay.
6. You will present a 7 minute maximum PowerPoint Presentation to the judges.
7. Anytime during your reign as king/queen, princess, or duchess, you are representing LCFA and are to be setting examples for the younger generation and peers. Your actions and social media reflect on this as well. If you do not uphold the LCFA standards of representation during your time of reign, you will be asked to relinquish your title and will not be able to run again. To be determined by King and Queen’s Committee.
8. After you reigned as King or Queen once, you may not run again.
9. Prior year King/Queen must attend Coronation to relinquish his/her title to the new King and Queen.
10. King/Queen will receive a buckle, sash, leather sash, flowers and a \$1,000 scholarship. Leather sash must be returned at the end of the reign. 1st runner up (Princess) will receive a buckle, sash, flowers and a \$750 scholarship. 2nd runner up (Duchess) will receive a buckle, sash, flowers and a \$500 scholarship. All others will be awarded a token of appreciation.

Junior Mister and Miss 6th – 8th Grade:

1. All general rules for contestants apply.
2. You will be required to write a minimum of 500 and maximum of 750 word essay.
3. You will be required to present a 6 minute maximum PowerPoint Presentation to the judges.
4. All winners will be required to help at the County Fair.
5. The winner will receive a buckle, sash, flowers and \$350.00. All other contestants will receive a token of appreciation.

Lil' Junior Mister and Miss 3rd – 5th Grade:

1. All general rules for contestants apply.
2. You will be required to write a minimum of 300 and maximum of 500 word essay. Topic to be determined by King and Queen's Committee.
3. You will be required to present a 3 to 5 minute maximum PowerPoint Presentation to the judges.
4. All winners will be required to help at the County Fair.
5. The winner will receive a buckle, sash, flowers and \$300.00. All other contestants will receive a token of appreciation.

Little Mister and Miss K-2nd Grade:

1. All general rules for contestants apply.
2. You will be required to write a 100 word essay.
3. You will be required to present a 2 to 3 minute maximum PowerPoint Presentation to the judges.
4. All winners will be required to help at the County Fair.
5. The winner will receive a buckle, sash, flowers and \$250.00. All other contestants will receive a token of appreciation.

Scoring Guidelines:

All judges are instructed to evaluate the capability of the contestants according to their age. **All judges' decisions are final and will NOT be up for review by contestants, parents, or leaders.** All ties will be broken during a line up or remodeling. Scoring will be on a 1-10 basis.

Point divisions:

Ticket Sales – 10%
Auction Items – 10%
Participation – 10%
Personal Interview – 20%
Essay – 20%
PowerPoint Presentation – 30%

****HORSE SHOW****

Eligibility:

- a. All Exhibitors must permanently reside in Limestone County and/or be enrolled in a Limestone County school, grades K-12. 4-H & FFA membership must be achieved by 11/1/19. Refer to page 3 of LCFA 2019-2020 rule book for complete eligibility rules.
- b. **All Exhibitors must be LCFA members by paying their \$10 family membership fee.**

Validation:

- a) Proof of horse ownership is required to participate in the LCFA Horse Show at time of validation (1/11/20).
- b) ****Exhibitor may either bring horse to validation or photos of front, back, and each side may be submitted for horse.**
- c) Horses not permitted to be validated for more than one exhibitor per division.
- a) Horse project validation fee is \$20.00 per entry/horse. Four horses allowed per exhibitors only.
- b) Each horse entering ring must be validated whether showing in any combination of halter and showmanship.
- c) **Negative** Coggins papers are required at time of validation and must be presented on the day of check-in.
- d) At the time of validation, each horse must be represented by Registration papers or Grade Horse ID Certificate (available at validation or online @ www.limestonefair.org).

Miscellaneous Show Rules:

- a. For Halter Division, exhibitors may enter two Mares and two Geldings and/or 1 of each.
- b. No horse or exhibitor will be allowed to enter the same class twice in each of the qualifying divisions.
- c. No stallions. Testicles must be removed by show day.

Halter Division (per state 4H horse show rulebook)

A halter class is defined as a class where the horse is judged based upon its conformation. The purpose of the class is to select individuals in the order of their resemblance to the breed ideal and that are the most positive combination of balance, structural correctness, breed and sex characteristics, and muscling. Halter class will be judged as a performance/stock horse halter division.

Attire: (Halter)

Riders shall wear western hat, long-sleeve shirts, and western boots. Western boots shall include typical cowboy boots and lace-up ropers. All other foot wear is prohibited. Any boot other than a leather sole boot is strongly discouraged

Halter Division Classes

- Geldings 4 and Under
- Geldings 5 and Over
- Mares 4 and Under
- Mares 5 and Over

Stock Horse Showmanship Classes

❖ Grade of member is determined on 9/1/2019.

- ***Pee-Wee Division*** will consist of members Grades K-2nd.
- ***Junior Division*** will consist of members Grades 3rd-5th and meet eligibility requirements.
- ***Intermediate Division*** will consist of members Grades 6th-8th and meet eligibility requirements.
- ***Senior Division*** will consist of members Grades 9th-12th and meet eligibility requirements.

Attire: (Stock Horse Showmanship)

Exhibitor's attire will be restricted to dark-colored jeans (such as blue, black, dark brown, dark gray) and a **light colored (white or buff), button-down (or snapped), undecorated, long-sleeved collared shirt**, cowboy boots and a cowboy hat or safety helmet. **No chaps, or chinks of any kind will be allowed in these classes.** A conservative scarf around the neck is allowed but should not detract from the overall conservative appearance of the exhibitor. Clothing should be neat and clean.

Proper Equipment: (Halter and Showmanship)

- Lip chains: Mares and geldings may not be shown with any chain through the mouth including but not limited to lip chains.
- Chaps and spurs are not permitted during Halter or Showmanship

Stock Horse Showmanship Only

- Tack should be traditional and conservative in appearance and should not display extraordinary silver or other decorations other than normal buckles and connectors. Judge may fault exhibitors who are in violation of the intent of this rule.
- No banded or braided manes, or hoof black will be allowed.

LCFA FAMILY & COMMUNITY HEALTH DIVISION ELIGIBILITY, RULES, & ENTRY FORM

I. Eligibility

The Family and Community Health Division of the LCFA is open to all residents of Limestone County and/or enrolled in Limestone County schools. The student must be eligible according to UIL standards and a member of 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA by November 1, 2019 (4-H members must have an ENROLLMENT CARD in the County Extension Office by November 1, 2019).

II. Rules

1. Each entry must be entirely the work of the exhibitor. Failure to do your own work will mean disqualification. Entries must have been produced between February 24, 2020 and March 27, 2020.
2. **FCH Validation/Entry forms are due March 6, 2020, before 5:00 pm.
3. **Entry form with name, age, grade, address, parent signature, telephone number, Club, and one copy of the recipe on the provided recipe form (if in the food class), may be turned in or mailed to the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service office, P.O. Box 191, Groesbeck, TX 76642, located on the ground floor of the Limestone County Courthouse, 200 W. State Street. Mailed entries must be received on or before the Validation date. Items postmarked/received after the due date will not be accepted.
4. Entry fees - \$10.00 for each food item and \$5.00 for all other items. Make checks payable to "LCFA."
5. Each family represented in the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show is required to pay a \$10.00 membership (See General Rule #1).
6. Only one entry per class, per exhibitor is allowed.
7. All entries must be brought to the fairgrounds between 7:00 am and 8:00 am on Friday, March 27, 2020. Entries will not be accepted at check-in if they do not comply with all rules, especially rule 11. Items must be complete upon arrival. You will not be allowed to adjust or set-up entries once you have checked in.
8. One copy of the recipe on an index card, **without** the participant's name, must be attached to the food item upon arrival. No logos on recipe cards, such as 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, or other will be allowed. Judges will disqualify entries without a recipe card.

9. **For food safety purposes, NO item requiring refrigeration will be accepted at check-in. This includes cheesecakes, custards, etc. Please do NOT bring butter or other toppings for items.
10. **All food entries must be on a disposable cardboard cake plate or a disposable (one use) foil pan. Items brought in plastic containers, chargers, plates, baskets, etc. will not be accepted. Items may be wrapped with clear plastic wrap or covered with the plastic lid that comes with the disposable (one use) foil pan. **No entries will be accepted covered in foil or with any added decorations.**
11. **All Items will be limited to the following sizes/amounts:
 - a. Cakes/Breads + Cake boards may not exceed 10in x 10in. Whole sheet cakes or items larger than 10in x 10 in will not be accepted.
 - b. Cookies may not exceed 1 dozen.
 - c. Muffins/cupcakes may not exceed 1 dozen.
 - d. Candies may not exceed 2 dozen.
12. **No purchased kits will be allowed in arts and crafts. Work must be entirely of the participant and original.
13. Entries in the pie class must contain homemade pie crust: store bought crusts will not be allowed.
14. Decorated Cakes will be judged based on presentation only and will not be eligible for Grand/Reserve.
15. Judging will begin at 9:00 am. The doors will be locked, and no one will be allowed into the judging area while judging is taking place.
16. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each class at the judge's discretion.
17. There will be a Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion awarded in the following categories: Cakes, Pies, Cookies, Breads, Brownies & Bar Cookies, and Candies. Decorated cakes will be judged on presentation only and will not be considered for Grand/Reserve. Only the Grand Champion will be auctioned.
18. A student can sell only one Grand Champion food item.
19. Any recipe that makes it to the auction cannot be entered the following year.
20. A Grand Champion winner must present the buyer with a freshly baked item. **It cannot be the item that was judged in the show.**
21. All entries must be left on exhibit until Silent Auction.
22. Every precaution is taken to protect all articles, but it is distinctly understood that in no case shall the LCFA, its Board Members, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and its employees, or Limestone County and its employees be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any character to any person, animal, vehicle, art work, exhibit or

article, while participating in FCS Division at the county show. Any insurance deemed necessary by an exhibitor must be provided by that exhibitor.

23. **An exhibitor may enter his or her food item in classes 1 through 9 to be sold in a bake sale. The LCFA cannot guarantee that items placed in the bake sale will be sold. Exhibitors receive all monies from items being sold in the bake sale. Any food item not sold in the bake sale will be discarded at 4:00 pm.
24. **If an exhibitor does NOT want to place his or her items into the Silent Auction, he or she needs to have marked the checkbox on the entry form and pick up the item(s) during the designated pick up time. **The LCFA, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, and Limestone County are not liable for any items being placed in the Silent Auction by mistake.**
25. Absolutely no animals allowed in the FCH Division building at any time.
26. There will be no viewing of items prior to Silent Auction taking place. Results will be posted outside the building for all to see once judging is complete.
27. Buyers for the FCH Division Silent Auction must be a registered buyer with the LCFA prior to silent auction. (Must have buyer number/information on file)

2. Projects exhibited must have been constructed and fabricated by FFA and 4-H Members as part of their agriculture mechanics instruction in Agricultural Science class or as part of their supervised work experience program.

3. All projects must be clean, painted or treated and in presentable condition even though they may have been used.
4. A working plan, blueprint or drawing and photographs showing construction and bill of materials are required to be submitted with each project entered.
5. All projects are to be identified with standard club exhibitor cards or computer generated cards that include the exhibitors name(s), chapter or club, school and project description.
6. A project can be exhibited only one time at the Limestone County Fair and must have been completed within one calendar year of the exhibition date.
7. Projects may have been individually or group constructed and may be individually or chapter owned. All projects must be entered in the names of the exhibitors who participated in planning and construction of the project.
8. Classes with less than four entries are subject to being combined.
9. Every precaution will be taken to protect the projects entered; however, neither the Limestone County Fair nor the officials of this show will be responsible for any losses or damages to projects.
10. Appropriate and safe display stands must be provided for gates, panels, and other projects that need support.
11. All trailers and other projects to be towed on public roads must be registered and licensed and must meet current Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) regulations. A copy of registration is required at check-in.
12. There is to be no more than two gallons of fuel in any fuel tank. The fuel tank cap is to be in place and sealed with tape. The battery is to be disconnected. This applies to all engines in the exhibit area.
13. No "For Sale" signs may be placed on projects.
14. All judge's decisions and announced results will be final.
15. An entry fee of \$20.00 will be charged per project entered.
16. Entry forms must be turned in on the day of check-in.
