

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I well remember my first real ANZAC Day dawn service with my father back in 1963 – cold, but I don't think I will ever forget hearing that clink of medals and the warm 'g'day to old friends – or the warmth of the mateship which just seemed to pour from them all.

Next year, I will spend ANZAC Day in New Zealand – it will be the 50th anniversary of my apprentice year (1970), and of the 105 of us who graduated in December of that same year, at this stage it looks like 87 of the old team will be able to make it. We have, of course, lost a few along the way, and I know that the spirit of ANZAC that bound us altogether nearly 50 years ago will cause us to reflect on the empty chairs we will have for each one when we sit down for dinner together. It will no doubt be a 'happy emotional' time for all of us as we take time to reflect on our service to country and the enduring mateship of that service.

It was certainly a year that changed the course of my life – as service in the Armed Forces has done for the countless thousands who went before us.

Looking back 100 years ago, Australia was right in the midst of bringing all our Diggers back from France following the end of the First World War. Ironically, and sadly, the great 'Spanish Flu' epidemic that followed the end of that war, cruelly carried away many of our finest who survived the horrors of the Belgium and France low-lands only to succumb to that awful epidemic in the safety of England.

Locally this year, it was a great disappointment to hear the announcement by the State RSL cancelling the traditional BBQ activities normally held at the Torrens Parade Ground following the annual ANZAC Day city march. I am sure, however, that the hue and cry which has followed will see appropriate sense prevail on the day and somehow the smell of barbequing snags, eggs and onions will be everywhere!

On the topic of BBQs, we had a great turn out for the **Mount Barker Show** day on the 23 March. Just as well, because we were flat out and had very successful day. Thanks to all who took part, I certainly enjoyed myself and found the whole day a very rewarding experience. What a great team!

Preparations for our **ANZAC Day** service in **Mount Barker** are now well in hand and I pass my sincere thanks to all those members toiling quietly away behind the scenes to make it all happen. Let's hope we have a calm morning and a great turnout once again. I look forward to seeing you all at the Mann Street Cenotaph at 6AM sharp for the Dawn Service – and then it's back at the **RSL for our traditional Gunfire Breakfast** – can't wait!
