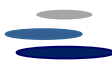

## Journalism Club Visits St. Albans Printing!



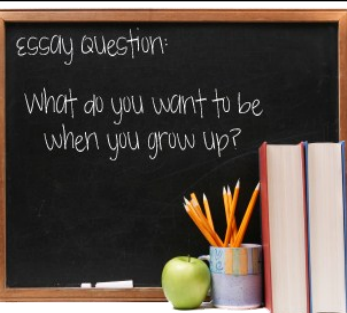
