





It has become necessary for us to address all of you who come to our dances regarding some problem areas.

Unfortunately, a number of people are attending our dances without giving a donation at the door. Boots "N" Buckles is a non-profit organization; our only source of revenue, which is used to pay our expenses each Friday night, is the monies received at the door.

Sometime ago it was decided that we would adopt an honor system for the door going into the bar area. Each week, more and more people are observed using that door as access to the dances. Continuation of this practice cannot be allowed. Our donation request is minimal and affords each of us hours of great dancing, music, and fellowship. Please cooperate by paying your way.

The dances are set up by your Board of Directors. We ask that you assist them by returning your empty glasses to the bar and by bussing your own table.

Many complaints have been received regarding some of the young people who have been attending our dances. Swiss Park is the home of the best and the most dedicated c/w dancers in the Bay Area. They do not like having to navigate around small children on the dance floor.

Effective August 7, no children under the age of 13 will be allowed admittance to our dances. We will continue to admit age groups 13 to 20 provided they are c/w dancers and have in their possession a card issued by Boots "N" Buckles certifying their interest in c/w dancing.

The teenagers that come to our dances will not be allowed to loiter in the parking lot, enter the bar for any reason other than to use the restroom, or to create obstacles on the dance floor. Dancers are reminded to practice proper dance etiquette and Western styling.

Your cooperation and effort is appreciated and will ensure each of us a pleasant dance experience.
