COUPLES, TAKE YOUR PLACES PLEASE!!!!!

The Time: 6:45am Saturday morning (or is it Sunday?) The Place: An empty banquet room in a very quiet, very dark hotel in Santa Rosaa 25'x25' portable wood dance floor with table cloths in several places to absorb the water from a leaky roof or a very smooth wood floor so big you have to block off only a section of it with a chair, and a hugh vaulted ceiling...with a magnificent view of the snow covered Sierra Nevada glistening above Lake Tahoe, or the third level of a parking garage in Fresno...sloping gently downhill, but at least cars have smoothed the concrete!!!!

The Why: Last minute practice for Country Western Dance Competition!!! The Benefits:

*Walking off the dance floor knowing you've done the best you could.

*Making the finals after hours of practice.*Hearing (and Feeling) the support of your Swiss Park "family" who are cheering, smiling and taking pictures-can't tell you how goo't makes you feel!! *Aerobic exercise (your fourth dance is a 3 minute and 40 second Schottische!)

The Feature: Where do we go from here, and how do we get there?

There are three primary Divisions of competition, 1, 2, and 3. A fourth, Division 4 is for novices, first time competitors and can be entered only once.

Division 3: This is where you pay your dues and learn the ropes of competition: Choreography, costumes, schedules, etc. Just making the finals can be reward enough since only 6: (less than 12 couples competing), 9 (12–15 couples), or 12 (more than 15 couples) are selected to compete the second day. In Fresno only 12 were chosen out of 53 Division 3 couples in Two-Step and Waltz! If you are of the top finalists, each partner is awarded individual points: 1st–10 pts; 2nd–6pts; 3rd–3pts; 4th–1pt. Once a couple has accumulated 40 points they may move into the higher division (2 or 1 as the case may be). If the couple wins two first places in two different dances, they must move into the next higher division.

There is one additional class: **Masters**. These competitors have been first place Grand Champions at two sanctioned events. Watching these very skilled dancers is a must for every Country Western Dancer-their moves and styling and costumes are beyond description, and are definitely an incentive to work a little harder to look just a little better.

In <u>colusion</u>, yes, there's alot of hard work involved, it takes time and planning and giving up other things in your life to compete, but there is no way to describe the wonderful feeling when you walk off the competition floor to the applause of the audience and the cheers of your Boots'n' Buckles family!!

STAR STRUCK IN NASHVILLE

The event was the 20th anniversary of "FAN FAIR" in Nashville, Ten. where the fans rumed elbows with their favorite Country Western Singers and if patient enough to stand in 2-4 hour long lines, they got their picture taken with the Star.

The program was this:

The Stars had booths where they would set 1 to 2 hr. time slots for picture taking and autograph signing throughout the day. When they were not in the booths, fan club members or workers would sell **STUFF** to the public such as T-Shirts, pens, posters, etc.-I bought a pair of Clint Black sunglasses. At the same time in another part of the fairgrounds there were concerts on and various other activities that you could attend.

Not being to fond of long hot lines with screaming fans and incredible crowds I decided to arm myself with my Nikon camera and Telephoto lens and take my own candid shots of anyone who looked like a Country Western Singing Star. This turned out to be easier than I thought (lots of people looked the part so it could have been confusing). All I had to do was find a booth with a crowd, do a little elbowing with a few "excuse me's" and 99% of the time I would end up a few feet from the likes of Loretta Lynn, Aaron Tippin, Clint Black, Ricky VanShelton, Travis Tritt, T.G. Shepard, Garth Brooks, The Oak Ridge Boys, Alan Jackson, just to name a few – I could go on and on – what a thrill! Lots and lots of the major stars were there plus a good number of old timers – I got a great picture of Hoyt Axton. Our own local singer, Sandy Ellwanger had her own booth and performed at the Independent Label Performers concert on Sat. The crowd loved her as was representatives from major performers. She is a fast rising star. She provided Shirley Johnson and I with V.I.P. passes so we were fortunate enough to see the goings on behind stage. Our club has scheduled her, once again, to do our Christmas Dance.

In addition to Fan Fair, Shirley and I and 40 others on the KEEN tour, toured Music Row, Grand Ole Opry House (the original one), went to a performance of Grand Ole Opry (the new one), saw Opry Land, Music Hall of Fame, the Stars homes – Nashvilles Beverly Hills, and some other places of note that I can't remember at the moment. Our hostess for this tour was Julie Stevens, D.J. at KEEN and Sara Adler from West Valley Travel. We danced at the **Wrangler** where they do the Tenn. I made a fool of myself pointing and trying to catch them as I did as a kid. Didn't catch any!
