


Guitars will twang and country/western dancers from all areas will head for "Joe Zanger's" weekend party. Boots "N" Buckles members will steer that direction towing trailers, driving motor homes, or the old station wagon with a tent for the kids. Of course, if you don't own an RV, come on down for the day or make reservations at the Casa de Motel right next to the campground. Your new Board of Directors is actively planning events for the next few months by meeting every first Wednesday of each month with an agenda full of old and new business. To pass on a few items, the Board of Directors has assigned the operation and responsibility of each Friday night dance to a rotation of Board members; for example, the president runs the first dance of the month, the vice president takes the second dance, the treasurer the third, and so on. This rotation gives the off-duty officers (Board of Directors) a chance to plan a weekend away or show up to dance and feel he or she is not on duty every week. Each one of your officers has committed to "door duty" for the entire evening on their duty night. Of course, you, as good members, can walk up any time and volunteer to take tickets for 30 minutes; alot of you already have, and we appreciate your help!

Have you noticed the bar lounge door is no longer manned by volunteers checking stamped hands! Your Board of Directors voted unanimously to return to the honor system.

Another item: Your Board of Directors is considering placing one permanent person to take donations at the entry door every Friday. A few volunteers are being considered. This will allow all our members to DANCE, DANCE, DANCE. Still appreciated is your volunteer help in arriving early to set up tables and chairs or staying late to help clean up.

Club functions other than Friday night dances will be discussed by the Board of Directors on the next Board agenda, and you will soon see a list of committees looking for help in order to stage some events. Some are (a) visits to other clubs in the area, (b) RV caravans for overnight events or long holiday weekends, (c) the summer picnic for families, complete with food, games, entertainment, and dancing, (d) a singles group which will meet for dinner on Friday nights before coming to the dances, (e) a junior auxiliary group for our dancers under 18 years of age.

Yep, when I told you your Board of Directors will roll up their sleeves and work, we meant it! Watch for next month's newsletter for an update of Board of Director actions and a soon-to-be-scheduled general meeting for the members to accept or reject any new club policies. This general membership meeting will be held at 8:00 p.m. on a dance night before our Dee Jay cranks up his music at 8:30 p.m.

With the close of 1986 activities, a few items were carried over to the 1987 Board of Directors, one of which is the Club's donation to a needy family. Although this report comes to you late, the new BOD wants all members to know what transpired.

During the December 19, 1986, Christmas dance, additional tickets were sold for the door prizes. These tickets were in addition to the ones you were given when you entered. We used a different color of ticket (blue) so as to keep a correct count, because your outgoing BOD stated that the Club would match this donation dollar for dollar up to 300 bucks. The exact count of blue tickets was 204, so a check was drafted for \$408 to Tri-City Volunteers to help a needy family in Alameda County, specifying Fremont or South East Bay. The canned food goods were also turned over to the same agency for dispersement and many nice thank you's were directed to your Club. Indeed, we should all feel proud that we were able to help someone less fortunate, and as details of the recipients come to me, I will surely pass it on to you in a later newsletter. STATE OF THE COUNTRY MESSAGE. (Country being Country Western dancing, of course).

The Red Rose Invitational at Reno in November 1984 was the first major C/W dance event I know of which included participation from several widespread areas. In 1985 the Reno event was repeated in Nov. and the Fresno Invitational was added in May. During 1986 things really got rolling with both the Reno and Fresno events being repeated and new events being held at Olympia, Washington; Santa Rosa and Pleasanton, California; Denver, Colorado; and Houston, Texas. In addition to these major events in 1986, there were several workshops, dance contests, and special dances held on a smaller scale. In 1987 I expect most of these major events to be repeated and a few other major events to be added. I expect most of the smaller events to be repeated on a bigger scale and many other small events to be added.

Country Western dancing was definitely alive and kickin' in 1986. I wish we had better records of the events and their attendance to document that there was a big surge in interest in C/W dancing in 1986. Although there were a few reported closings of C/W bars or conversion to rock music, others went to more C/W nights per week and others seemed to cater more to C/W dancers. Many teachers have reported substantial increases in their students, in fact some teachers who have been teaching for several years reported that their 1986 classes were the largest ever. This has certainly been the case at Swiss Park.

What factors caused this big surge of interest in 1986? My opinion is that communication and organization were the key factors. Country Dance Lines magazine played an important part in the publicity of C/W events. Dancers became more organized with the formation and growth of several associations for teachers and dancers, local social dance clubs, and performing groups. These organizations reinforced the communication through their newsletters, meetings and word of mouth.

BOOTS 'N' BUCKLES had a great year in 1986 but I predict that 1987 will be even better. Hosting dances at Swiss Park every Friday night in 1987 rather than every two weeks is a big start. The new Board has the dedication and enthusiam needed to really make this club take off and perhaps gain the reputation as the most active club in the Bay Area. Lets all get behind them and watch the boots fly! (Written by C.W. Parker 1/5/87).

Now that we have dances every Friday, let's point out some basic facts. Membership dues are \$10 per year to help support your Club. Friday night donations are \$1.25 for members and \$2.00 for guests. Say a person attends around 40 dances a year (75%) and pays the guest price, that totals \$80 per year. By joining Boots "N" Buckles Dance Club, your annual outlay is \$60 which includes dues! You save twenty bucks, receive a discount card for purchases at local c/w apparel stores and can pocket more bucks. The biggest bonus is that you are contributing to the operation of a nice, friendly place to dance, meet friends, and call this place your own. With the new tax law, I think your \$10 membership can be deducted, but check on it first. So you see, join now and avoid the rush!!


