

My partner echoes all my moves in perfect harmony, - A silent conversation for everyone to see.


The joy's beyond explaining - no other sport comes close. If every art's a flower, then dancing is the rose.

The Piggy Bank -

During the Middle Ages, mined metal was scarce, expensive and thus rarely used in the manufacture of household utensils. More abundant and economical throughout Western Europe was a type of dense, orange clay known as pygg. It was used in making dishes, cups, pots, and jars, and the earthenware items were referred to as pygg. Frugal people then, as now, saved cash in kitchen pots and jars. A "pygg jar" was not yet shaped like a pig, but the name persisted as the clay was forgotten. By the eighteenth century in England, pygg jar had become pig jar, or pig bank. Potters, not usually etymologists, simply cast the bank in the shape of its common, everyday name!

We started out in England then on to Ireland and into Scotland. Starting in London for the first 3 days, we found the people were super friendly and very helpful. They drive like a bunch of race track drivers though like they are the only ones out there. We left the Airport for the Hotel and thought we were with a race driver. If you were going to cross the street and the light turned red before you got to the other side, you had better start running. There is no way you would want to drive in London. Once you got out of town it would be ok. There is so much old history, you could spend weeks in just one city. Cathedrals two thousand years old and on back to King Henry and the Romans and the Vikings. Lots of pubs every where, and good beer. Went down town one night to an area called Piccadilly Circus.
