The most spectacular midnight buffet was on Thursday night. They had it set up an hour early just so people could take pictures. It looked too good to eat. Ice carvings of dragons, the ship, an ice bowl for the shrimp, a chocolate bird cage complete with marzipan birds, a checkerboards of white & dark chocolate, etc.

Friday was spent on NCL's Pleasure Island. And what a pleasure it was. The biggest beach party you'll ever attend. The BBQ was provided by the ship, They had ping pong, horseshoe, volleyball and of course plenty of beach for sunning. We all tried snorkeling, even yours truly.
