brings back memories of the holidays we enjoyed early in our lives. It is refreshing to see the world through a child's eyes. Everything that we take for


granted is so new and fresh for them.

Referring to last month's OPINION SPEAK OUT - I would like to add a few words. Bill Parrish was right for the nice bank balance of \$7000 versus the treasury hovering around the \$2000 mark. We were sustaining monthly losses three years ago. It took consistent and I may say, years of vigilant, hard work and frugal. conservative efforts on the part of the executive board. For the benefit of those members who were not around or choose not to be aware, in 1997 under the leadership of Jim Frederick, the executive board initiated cost cutting measures and fundraising events which benefited the club. Each subsequent year, the presiding board carried out the fundraising events mainly the annual workshop, and spent conservatively. Just because you may have made a million or are a Bill Gate's twin, this club still looses money 50% of the weeks in most months. We need this margin of positive cash flow to cushion dismal weeks when attendance is low. Also, the board always welcomes suggestions on how to attract board members and increase attendance on Friday nights' dances. Just remember we cannot afford hefty consultation fees, and no stock options are available! Wishing you all a Happy and Wonderful New Year . . .





As far as the Friday night dances are concerned, only two of the four dances were profitable, and the net for the month was a \$69 loss. Since we pre-paid the price of the annual Christmas dinner however, we did recognize the additional revenue of \$897 in November, but that will

be offset when we pay for all of the dinners on December 15th. (We won't worry about that until the December report.) None the less, we ended the month with a profit of \$1007.80, and our year-to-date check book balance at the end of November was \$8363.03. I think we have a lot to be proud of and thankful for considering the sound financial state the club is now enjoying. I certainly hope the trend continues into the new year.

Speaking of which, by the time you get this newsletter, the holidays will have already zoomed by, so I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season, and that you're ready to start dancing off all of those calories you collected at our January 5th dance. See you then.
