




Christmas dinner ticket sales were also strong, and that brought in an additional \$1700 in revenue for the month. Once again the

expenses were rather low, with less than \$100 going toward postage and supplies, and \$1300 for rent. The final figure for the month was a profit of \$3562.69, but a significant portion of that money will go out in December when we pay Swiss Park for the Christmas Dinner. Never the less, November was a truly stellar month, and our year to date profit after November was \$4640.77. That pumped up our bank account to a total of \$15,169.43, so I'd say the club is in a very sound state to start out the New Year.

This is my last report as Treasurer of Boots 'n' Buckles Dance Club, but that doesn't mean you've seen the last of me. I'll be out there dancing up a storm (after I take some classes) just like the rest of you. Best wishes to you all for a healthy and prosperous New Year.
