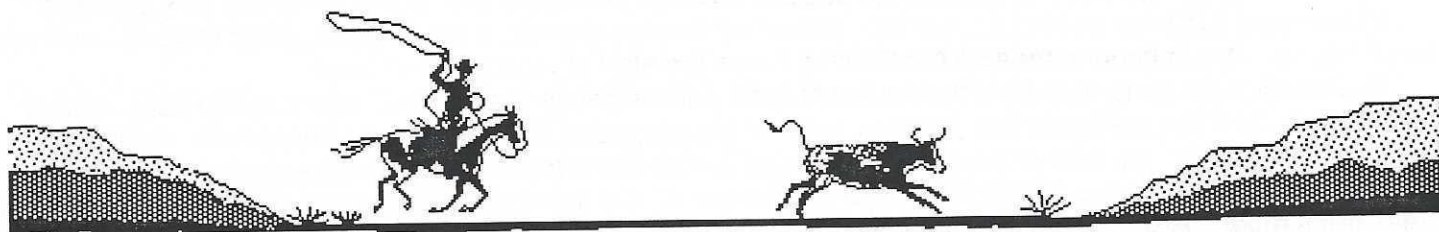

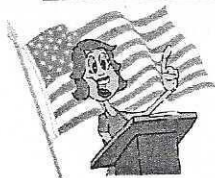

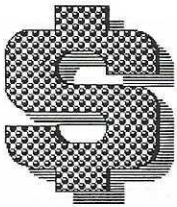

Happy New Year Everyone-

By the time you read this Christmas will have come and gone, and all of us will be embracing a brand new year... Hopefully, 2003 will be a prosperous and good year for all of you. I've got a dozen or so New Year's resolutions I'd like to make, but first and foremost on the list is to get myself back out on the dance floor!

It seems strange to talk about the month of November, when we've already started the new year. We need to discuss old business though before we can move on to any new business.

There were 5 dances held in November. Two of the dances showed a small profit, while three showed very small losses. This is understandable considering it was the start of the holiday season.

Revenues were generated from the usual sources: admissions to the dances, membership dues, sale of raffle tickets, and rent collected from classes held on Mondays and Wednesdays at Swiss Park. Additional revenues came from the sale of tickets to the annual X-mas dinner/dance. Since sales started in October, we have sold 78 tickets totaling \$1560.00. A final breakdown of the ticket sales/expenses will be in the December treasurer's report. Also, a final tally of the McDonald's "After School Snack Pack" coupons, which has earned the club \$163.00, will be discussed.

Some of the expenses incurred for the month included: DJ, 50/50 raffle, instructor fees, rent paid to Swiss Park, printing & postage for Roundup, and refreshments. Overall for the month Boots 'N' Buckles netted a profit of \$1,354.27. A major portion of this amount will be used to pay for the X-mas dinner; an expense not incurred until after mid-December. The checkbook balance at the end of November was \$12,379.25.

This concludes my report. Keep on dancing!

New Year's Recipes . . .

Mock Champagne

1 64oz bottle white grape juice

1 2 liter bottle Sprite

Mix in equal parts. Add ice. Garnish with orange slices or strawberries. (can use sugarfree juice/Sprite)

Black-Eyed Pea Salad

2 15oz can black eyed peas, drained

1/2 c chopped red onion

1/2 c chopped green pepper

1/2 clove garlic

1/4 c vinegar

1/4 c vegetable oil

1/2 tsp salt

Dash of pepper

Dash of Hot Sauce

Combine 1st 4 items, toss lightly. Combine remaining items, mixing well and pour over pea mixture. Cover and refrigerate at least 12 hours. Remove garlic clove before serving. Makes 6-8 servings.

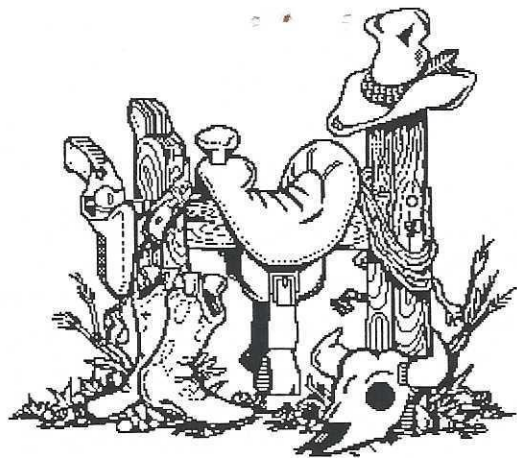
