WEDNESDAY CLASS FORMAT CHANGE

Dance Style

The following item was prepared on 12/26/88 by C.W. Parker for submission to the NTA Terminology Committee. C.W. Parker is a founding member of Boots 'N Buckles. You are welcome to send any comments to the NTA.

COUNTRY WESTERN DANCE STYLING

Country Western partner dancing is done generally in a continuous, flowing, progressive, counterclockwise direction around the floor.

A natural, smooth movement is a very important part of C/W dancing, so dancers use a relaxed posture with slightly flexed knees, keep their feet close to the floor, step flat footed, and move with a level gliding motion.

C/W dancing is done is a variety of positions, but when dancing face to face, the standard

position is for the man's right hand or wrist to be on the lady's left shoulder with her left arm resting on his arm or her left hand hooked above his elbow.

C/W dancing has a conservative, modest style, so drops, flips, lifts, and other acrobatic movements are frowned upon as overly showy. Ballet style movements such as poses, balances, leg lifts or kicks are also not acceptable. Upward extended single arm movements, dangling or swing arms or other expressive arm movements are out of place in C/W dancing. If a hand is not joined with the partner's hand, it is held to the waist area both in partner and line dances.

Synchronized movement is emphasized in all aspects of C/W dancing. Dancers actually dance together! In partner dancing, couples dance in complete unison as one unit with both dancers moving in time to the beat of the music. All couples even dance the same fixed pattern at the same time when doing round dances with a stop and go pattern. In line dancing, all individuals dance the same routine.

When doing C/W dancing, dancers wear western attire. This includes cowboy boots for all and cowboy hats for the men.

DANCE AT THE WEST 40 CLUB

This club is located at Misssion and Warms Springs Blvd. in the Franciscan Center. Dance lessons are offered on Wednesday and Thursday nights. On Sunday evenings lessons are offered from 5 to 7. After the lessons a dinner special if offered. Children are welcome until 9pm.


