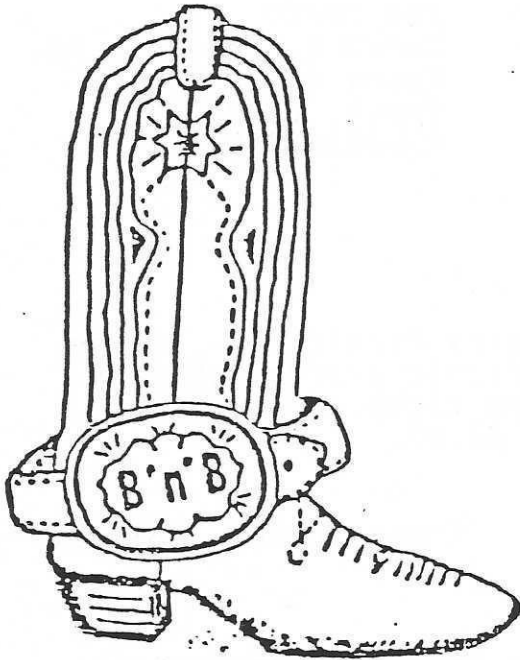
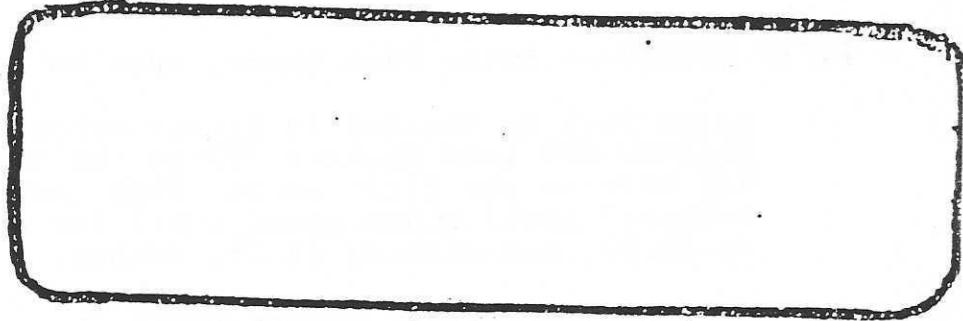

Club membership badges have arrived and are being distributed at our Friday night dances. The badges look great, and we hope you will wear them to not only our dances, but to all other functions you might attend.

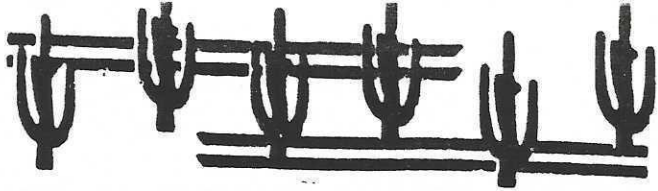
\* \* \* \* \* JULY 25TH PICNIC \* \* \* \* \*
