There were many other people who helped us set up the hall for the day, helped get the tables set up for dinner, and helped clean up at the end of the evening. Without your many hands (and backs) it would have taken the Board a lot longer to get everything ready. Finally, I want to thank every member of the Board of Directors. Each of us played an integral part in the success of the day. I am extremely fortunate and privileged to work with a dedicated, harmonious group of people who are concerned about bringing the club members the highest quality we can to every club activity. I designed and printed the tickets and signs, lead the donation committee, and coordinated the distribution of the door prizes every hour. The Treasurer Sez...

Once again the Friday night dances were not particularly profitable during May.

We lost money at three of the four Friday night dances, but the third dance of the month was a big success and nearly made up for all the other losses. We ended the month losing only \$45 during our weekly dances. Workshop ticket sales were very strong during the month however, which resulted in an additional \$858 in revenue. That, coupled with the fact that we paid May's rent during the last week of April, lead to a final profit of \$2001 for the month.

Speaking of the workshop, it was a rousing success, both socially and financially. The combined revenue from ticket, raffle, and water sales totaled \$2996.50, and total expenses were \$1434.97 including the refund of one ticket. The resulting profit was a grand total of \$1531.53, which will definitely help keep the club in the black for the year. I want to thank all the workshop attendees, instructors, Bob Hubbard, the donation committee, and my fellow board members for making the 4th Annual Workshop and Social such a wonderful success.




