## **ELECTION RESULTS**

### Election Results - Bylaw Changes -

During the November 4th dance, the members present voted on the proposed Bylaw changes; the result was overwhelming approval (over 90% voted yes).

The plan for implementing Article IV Executive Board is as follows:

Nominations for the new Board of Directors are now open and if you are willing to be a board member please <u>fill out the nomination</u> form on page 4, and send it in or give it to any present board member.

Please think about supporting the club by serving on the Board. With the new bylaws you don't have to be an officer to serve on the Board. - Thank you -

The way it will work during this transition election is as follows: The five nominee's who receive the most votes will be elected for a one year term, subject to agreement by the nominee, and the next five nominee's for a six month term. Then the new Board of Directors will meet and elect officers for the next six months.

During the dance on November 25th we will announce the nominee's and have open nominations from the floor

ELECTIONS FOR THE NEW BOARD WILL BE DECEMBER 9.

### THE NEW BY-LAWS

### Article IV Executive Board

A. The Executive Board shall be comprised of ten elected Directors. Five Directors will be elected every six months and will serve for a one year term of office or until successors are elected. Any vacancy during the term of office will be filled by the Executive Board to serve until the next regular election.

- B. After each election the new and continuing Directors will meet and elect officers for the next six month period. The following officers shall be elected: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Vice-president Membership. The immediate past president will also be a voting member of the Executive Board if their term as a director has expired.
- C. Candidates for election as Club Directors may be submitted in writing to any Board member and must be members in good standing at the time of election and during their term of office. The five candidates who receive the most votes will be the new directors.

### Article III - Membership

### A. Eligibility

- 1. Regular membership in the Boots' N' Buckles Dance Club is open to All C/W dancers and those interested in becoming C/W dancers who are 18 years of age or older with all rights and privileges of membership.
- 2. Associate membership in the Boots' N' Buckles Dance Club is open to All C/W dancers and those interested in becoming C/W dancers who are under 18 years of age with all rights and privileges of membership except the right to vote in elections.

# Changes at Swiss Park Dance Lessons for 1988

### Wednesday evening - Beginners:

Starting in January 1989 we will be trying a new format for the couple's dance. We will select one of the basic couple's dance and develop it progressively through a month rather than teach a different dance each week. We will start out with the basic step pattern on the first week and emphasize styling and technique along with the development of combinations of turns for the following weeks.

### Monday evening - Intermediate/Advanced

In the past few years the level of dancing at Swiss Park has risen dramatically. Some of you have expressed an interest in competition, and indeed some of you have already competed successfully in the major competitions throughout California and the West. We recognize the fact that in order for you t continue to grow and have the winning edge on the dance floor, you will need other points of view besides ours. We will therefore spare no expense to induct the services of the top instructors/competitors to do classes at Swiss Park.

We're actually getting started with this policy in November, and there's no better way to start than with the King, himself..... Rich Small, on November 7. Please be advised that video cameras from at least three different angles will be running.

In December....a rising star, Dave West will be back for a return engagement with his award winning swing moves.

January 1989 will begin with Gloria Casey and Jim Carlyle. Gloria and Jim consistently place high in every competition they enter. They have been dancing together for two years now, and are two of the smoothest instructor/competitors around. 


