
All Boots 'n' Buckles' Friday night dances start at 8:00 PM, even on lesson nights.

Treasurer's Report

HI everyone. Hope you had a great HALLOWEEN. Another year has gone bye, and the holidays are just around the corner. Oh my goodness! It won't be long until tickets go on sale for the Holidaiy Dinner Dance.

This report is for the month of September. It was a good month for Boot "N" Buckles.
Revenues totaled \$3,148.00. Income came from the usual sources: dances, rent collected from instructors for classes taught & 50/50 raffles. A lot of dancers decided September was the month to renew their annual club membership, which brought in \$540. Four ances were held and showed a profit after expenses were deducted.

Expenses incurred totaled \$2,021.58. Rent paid to Swiss Park was the largest expense. Other expenses included music, 50/50 raffle, and a few miscellaneous items. The club netted a profit of \$1,126.42 for the month. The checkbook has a balance of \$9,654.31.
