

While planning a trip in our motorhome, I dragged out some old campground maps and rifled thru them looking for something along the Coast. A big magnet seemed to pull my attention to the PISMO BEACH area which lies about four hours driving time south of us and is right off US 101 between San Luis Obispo and Santa Maria. I remembered meeting a very nice couple at one of JIM SNEED'S workshops in Fremont last year who not only lived in Pismo Beach, but he (VERN BLACK) was also president of the CENTRAL COAST COUNTRY WESTERN DANCE CLUB. My wife, SHARON, wrote a short note to VERN asking for any events during our visit or good c/w dance spots in the area, and we would appreciate his return letter.

Unknown to us for the moment, was the most enjoyable time planned by VERN, his lovely wife, LOIS, and members of the CCCWDC. We stayed at the PISMO COAST VILLAGE RV PARK, which is right on the beach and offers full hook ups, store, restaurant, and a recreation center geared for all ages. They hire a full-time recreation director who schedules live music, comedy acts, jugglers, and sponsors dances every weekend. All this plus their location offering the surf, fishing, or just people watching!

A marquee informs all guests as to who is appearing that weekend, and we blinked when we read "Today--dance to country tunes by the "White Mountain Band" and be entertained by the CCCWDC! Yep, VERN'S dance team was performing right there are our RV park.

We met each and every member of the dance team and accompanied them to a small rec-room where they talked over and made last minute adjustments for their performance. Gosh, what friendly people! Honestly, we felt like we were part of their club the way they treated us. Their performance was excellent, and the audience let them know it, too!

We stayed and danced into the evening enjoying the aforementioned band. VERN and LOIS then hosted some people at their house for a late dinner which we were invited, and I compliment them both on the beautiful party and friendship they extended. Cont'd.

Now about this time if we were home, I'd be thinking of sawing logs, but not these folks! All VERN has to do was mention, "Let's go dancin'!" and everybody headed for the door, saying "Let's dance to the One-Man Band!"

Again, we were taken to another place (Pismo Beach Moose Lodge Hall) where we were treated to music by a fella (named PAUL) who played the guitar, harmonica, and sang to some electronic background, and amazed us with his repertoire of songs. We kept requesting c/w songs, and he kept playing until we left in the wee hours of the a.m. SHARON and I shared, taught, and swapped dance steps with all our friends which we had made that day. We were introduced to a beautiful lady who welcomed us warmly and complimented our dancing. She said "I can do all the partner dances, but have trouble with the line dances . . . after all", she continued, "I am 92 years old!" I'll never forget this lady, and I pray that all of us will be "dance active" and reach her golden age.

On Sunday Pismo City hosted a "Blue Grass Band Festival", and many c/w dancers attended. The CCCWDC meets every Sunday afternoon in Santa Maria for a short meeting, lessons, and dancing afterwards.

We spent another two days in the area, taking in auto racing (hard tops) in Santa Maria, cheered and struggled with one of the local fishermen as he landed a 7 foot shark caught off the Municipal Pier! Great restaurants . . . ALEX'S, great steaks and ribs in Shell Beach, the Madonna Inn Coffee Shop, the Whales Tale in Morro Bay, etc., etc.

Have to go back to see Solvang, the Mission and Museum in San Luis Obispo, and P.G. & E's nuclear plant, "Diablo Canyon" which now offers tours, but most of all, we would like to return to experience the wonderful comraderie which LOIS and VERN BLACK and the Central Coast C/W Dance Club extended to us. WHERE WE'RE COMING FROM

FACTS & FALLACIES OF SWISS PARK DANCE CLASSES

One particularly sultry spring evening about four years ago I stopped by the South 40 Club in Fremont for a bottle of Calistoga water. I had only intended to hang around for a short while to listen to a few tunes on the juke box, but as fate would have it, I met two people that evening who would dramatically influence the way I would spend my leisure hours in the years to come. One, of course, was Charlotte with whom I teach dance lessons and the other was C.W. Parker. C.W., for those of you more recent arrivals on the country/western dance scene, is the handle of Charles Parker who, at that time, was teaching country/western dance lessons on Tuesday evenings.

Without a doubt C.W. was the most dedicated and one of the best instructors I had ever taken lessons from. At that time he was forming a country/western dance club, the Country Kickers, from a core group of students who

were taking his dance lessons.

I believe there were about a dozen or so of us at the time. If I remember correctly, there was a chain of events which led to the demise and later reformation of this club under the direction of Rick Bowen as the present day Boots "N" Buckles Dance Club.

In the following few years the public would demonstrate an ever increasing interest in C.W.'s dance lessons and in being affiliated with a country/western dance club. C.W. realized that to accommodate this growth a much bigger dance environment was necessary. He consequently negotiated for us what is probably the best dance environment in the East Bay...Swiss Park.

The country/western dance scene began organizing on more than a local level and Rick Bowen became the first President of the newly formed Northern California Dance Teachers Association. C.W. more recently formed the National Association of Country Western Dance Teachers. Both Rick Bowen and C.W. have since moved from the Bay Area to take up the cause elsewhere.

When C.W. left he approached Charlotte and I with the prospect of taking over Swiss Park Dance Classes. By this time Charlotte and I had been instructors on his staff for over a year and he felt that we were the logical choice to carry on what had become a very important pastime for many of us on Monday and Wednesday evenings.

With this bit of perspective I now want to explain just what Swiss Park
Dance Classes are all about and what our relationship with the Boots "N" Buckles

Dance Club is.

Right about the time C.W. left in the Spring of this year, it became obvious that, in order to serve the public better, it would be best to divide the more novice dancers from those who were more intermediate or advanced. We, therefore, on Wednesday evenings teach a basic core of stock country/western dances that encompass fundamental moves that are necessary in order to grasp the more complicated dances and moves that are taught on Monday evenings. Occassionally, if an advanced dance proves to be an extremely popular one, we will teach it on a Wednesday at a slower pace.

Swiss Park Dance Classes are first and foremost a learning experience, but it is also intended to be fun. It is an occassion for many of us to get together once or twice a week in a relaxed environment. It is one of the best opportunities I have ever experienced for meeting new people and making new friends.

As a logical extension of Swiss Park Dance Classes, the Boots "N" Buckles

Dance Club offers Friday night dances in an unintimidating environment for novice students to show off their newly acquired skills. Our dance classes are not officially affiliated with the Club, but there is nevertheless a close bond between us, as dance classes are generally the starting point for one's awareness of and interest in joining the club.

Both Dance Classes and Friday Night Dances offer a healthy environment where adolescents through senior citizens can enjoy themselves. I'm sure most of us will agree that this is a welcome alternative to the typical bar

Spending some time at dance classes is a good prerequisite to insure getting the most enjoyment out of Friday night dances.

It is our intention to give the best dance classes possible. This can only be achieved by the staff being constantly objective as to themselves as instructors and to the quality of dance lessons it is giving. The staff presently consists of Charlotte Skeeters, myself, and Ganean De LaGrange who instructs on Monday evenings. We also occassionally have guest instructors who come in to teach specialty moves or dances we haven't learned yet.

We thoroughly research and prepare lessons before class time as we feel anything taught the wrong way is a grave reflection on the entire staff. Occassionally we make mistakes but generally the mistakes are caught by another instructor and the correction is made at the time.

We feel the sound system and music should be of a quality so as not to become tiresome and monotonous for the students. Every effort is therefore made to insure quality recordings of the latest tunes that are appropriate for the dances being taught.

We encourage constructive criticism from students as we have received many good ideas from them in regards to dance lessons and the atmosphere in which they should be taught.

It is our opinion that instructors should present themselves professionally in every way. We believe that competition among dance instructors, as with any enterprise in the marketplace, is very healthy and ultimately proves beneficial to the student populace.

Finally, in order to preserve Swiss Park Dance Classes and Friday Night Dances, it is necessary that each and every one of us be constantly alert to the fact that we are all guests at Swiss Park. We must all be caretakers to our very special situation and never allow anyone to "rock the boat" by causing dissension between us and the owners. It is only through the preservation of this situation that our Club and Dance Lessons can survive.

On behalf of the staff at Swiss Park Dance Lessons I would like to say that we thoroughly enjoy your companionship and comradery.

Let's continue to.... Keep on dancin'
