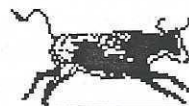

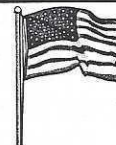


The Haunted House

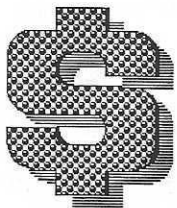

Hi everyone-

With temperatures nearing the 90-degree mark one would think it was the middle of summer, but the wind blowing the leaves across the front yard lets me know otherwise. Fall is upon us whether we like it or not.

The month of August was a good month for Boots 'N' Buckles. Total revenues collected from the dances totaled \$1,531, while 50/50 raffle sales totaled \$486. Of the five dances held four netted profits.

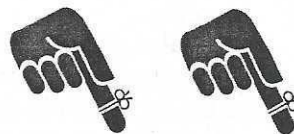
Although the profits weren't huge, it still kept the club from being in the red for August. Also included was \$472 collected from dues paid during the start of this year's membership drive. The month of September should bring in more dues.

Expenses included \$1300 paid to Swiss Park for rent, \$875 for music, \$150 for the door-person, \$233 for the 50/50 raffle, \$94.63 for printing & postage, and \$69.59 used to buy a cake & flowers for Charlotte.

Other expenses encumbered were a DJ bonus, instructor fees, and water. Included for the month too was \$656 collected from the purchase of club sweatshirts and tees. Previously collected was \$452. Another \$100 will be deposited in September. The club made little or no profit on the sale of these items. The club was given discounts by Logos Promotional Marketing, but sales tax was not passed on to members. What the club saved in discounts was used to pay the sales tax. Everyone looks great by the way and what good advertisement too! As of September 20th, the checkbook has a balance of \$11,660.04.

That is my report for the month of August. I hope to be back dancing soon as I have been nursing a foot injury. One note of celebration: I have a new grandson, Zachary Ryan, who was born on September 14th and weighed in at 8-lb. 14 oz. Keep on dancing!

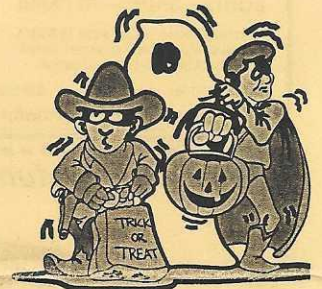

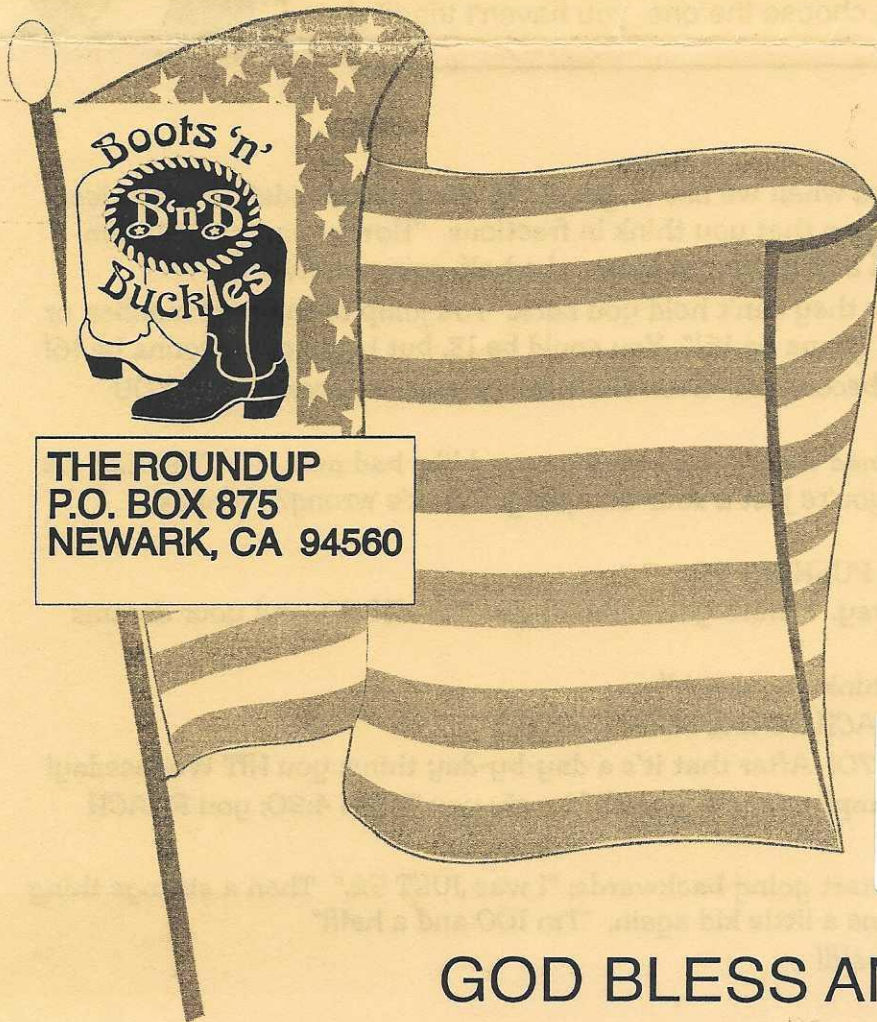
