

Vows

The vows are the most important part of the wedding ceremony as this it is the moment couples make their promises to each other.

While your vows can include almost anything you desire, there is a short statement that both partners must legally say. It is:

"I call upon the persons here present to witness that I [Name], take thee, [Name], to be my lawful wedded [wife/husband/spouse]."

These mandatory words must include your legal names, not nicknames. Many couples ask me what exactly these legal vows mean - they're phrased in an unfamiliar, and somewhat archaic way. Basically, you're asking all your guests to be witnesses to you taking your beloved to be your legal spouse! The legally required wording must be included, and you may add any personal form of vows.

If you'd like to try writing your own vows, this handy guide may be just what you are looking for!

Adding personal vows to your legal vows add a special bit of sparkle and gooey love to your ceremony. It's your chance to tell your partner what you promise for your relationship to come. It is your opportunity to make your vows a response to the aweinspiring marriage ceremony that you are both taking part in. It gives you the chance to make sure your significant other knows without a doubt how you feel and what promises you are making in response to the vows you're both legally committing to.

While you can choose to write your own vows (and I encourage you to give it a go!) please don't feel any pressure to come up with something completely unique. If it's just not working for you, I have included plenty of examples and ideas to get the gooey-ness started. And there are plenty of resources on the internet too.

One more thing to think about is HOW your want your vows to be said. There are a few options. We can do the traditional "repeat after me" vows, or you can hold vow cards and read them yourselves without the cues from me. The one bit of advice I do recommend is DO NOT attempt to memorise either the legal vows or your personal vows - your wedding day is extremely emotional and you're bound to forget something really important!

If there isn't anything in this guide that tickles your fancy, don't despair! Do an internet search for 'How do I write my vows?". The last time I did that search I was presented with 22,400,000 results. And if you can't find anything from those 22 million ideas, perhaps just stick with the legal vows – I will still make your ceremony beautiful!



Vow Writing Prompts

Below are some questions you could use to help you write your vows.
