Prior to her publishing and writing career, Vanita taught school for 19 years and then helped her husband with his company, Oak Associates. She is a mother of two daughters, stepmother to a son and daughter, and grandmother to ten. She and her husband Jim received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Multiple Sclerosis Society in 2006. She was named National Volunteer of the Year by the MS society in 2008.
