This purchase is predominantly the result of a grant of \$18,600 from the Gaming Community Fund and the work of Wayne Schulz and his application skills. Thanks Wayne on behalf of the Club.

As this is the 60th anniversary of the Club's foundation, watch out for the updates on the luncheon planned to celebrate this important occasion. It will see the opening of the time capsule and the raffle of a beautiful pendant, the stones having been cut by the Gold Coast Facetor's Guild and kindly set by Mr John Bostock.

I take this opportunity (in fact I take every opportunity) to remind you that you have ten months to find a new president. A new president must be elected at the next Annual General meeting in May next year.

#### **IMPRESSED**


