Out & About

Fossicking Trips

Most of the **fossicking trips at the Club are led by Luke Smith**, who takes on the responsibility of the pre-planning and coordination for each trip. This year he's planning to do some hikes to new spots around the region as well as revisiting some of the trusted favourites.

A provisional plan for this year's fossicking adventures is shown below; however all exact timing will be confirmed on the Club noticeboard.

One trip Luke is considering this year is an overnight stay in the Hogarth Ranges of Northern New South Wales. The Hogarth Ranges are about 30km west of the town of Casino and about 2 and a half hours' drive southwest of the Gold Coast.

Day 1 would be looking for gem quality Labradorite wash in the local creek, before setting up an overnight bush camp and a meal & chat around the campfire. Day 2 would start back down the creek for an hour or two and then follow on with a walk to some local Pegmatites in the area for further fossicking.

There are lots of options for fossicking trips around Queensland and New South Wales, although some are more weather dependent than others, so flexibility can be required. Fossicking plans for this year will take account of geology, gemstone types, locality, and accessibility. Nothing that's too technical and generally suitable for most ages and fitness levels; however, it's important that if anyone has medical issues then please do let Luke know in advance of the trip so he can discuss and make sure of suitability.

Once again, keep your eye on the Club noticeboard for exact timing of all future fossicking trips.

The Norman Donpon Lapidary Display - Miles Historical Village Museum, Miles, QLD

A treasure trove of lapidary information awaits you at the Norman Donpon Lapidary Display (NDLD) on the Western Downs of Queensland. The NDLD is in the country town of Miles, about 4.5hrs drive northwest of the Gold Coast. The museum's lapidary display showcases over 4000 local and international specimens of petrified wood, gemstones, minerals and fossils and is popular with paleobotanists, geologists and lapidary enthusiasts.

The collection houses many examples of petrified wood from the Chinchilla / Western Downs areas of Queensland with the petrified wood displaying an amazing array of earthy colours. Chinchilla district is known for producing a reddish colour petrified wood, dubbed "Chinchilla Red", which is unique to the area. The stone is prized for its high quality of textural preservation and beautiful colour, showcasing the familiar patterns and textures of wood but feeling and weighing like stone. The hardness of the stone is typically between 7 (quartz) and 8 (topaz) on the Mohs Scale and it is commonly left in its natural state or slabbed and cut to cabochon.

The process of wood petrification takes place under appropriate geological conditions. After plants die and fall into the soils, soluble silica, moving with the water in silica-rich soils, can precipitate and settle within the cell spaces and structures of plants, depositing thin films of amorphous silica over the cell structure of the plant. Over time the organic structure of the plant decays and is fully removed, leaving behind the resistant inorganic silica and transforming the original wood to stone as either opal (closely packed silica spheres) or compact fibrous or granular microcrystalline quartz (chalcedony).

Fossickers can also explore the Western Downs area for the rare petrified Pentoxyylon, an extinct tree fern dating back to the Jurassic and Early Cretaceous time periods. These plants lived during the middle to late Mesozoic (around 100 – 170 million years ago) and can be identified by a characteristic five wedge pattern seen in the trunk. A recent internet search revealed an 8-inch wide petrified Pentoxyylon slab on sale for US\$475 (around A\$750).

If you're interested in fossicking for Chinchilla Red or other petrified wood specimens, (you'll need the appropriate fossicking approvals and licenses), it's helpful to visit the lapidary display so that you're aware of what you may encounter whilst out in the field. The Historical Village Museum in Miles is about a 30-minute drive from the two general permission fossicking areas in Chinchilla and most specimens are easily found on the ground or just below the surface.

The Great Artesian Basin interpretive centre building is also sited within the Miles Historical Village Museum, beside the NDLC. The centre contains a large graphic illustration of the cross section of the eastern part of the Great Artesian Basin with geological time scales and core rock samples from over 1500m below the earth's surface. Visitors can sit down, relax and enjoy an educational 5-minute video explaining the geological formation, location of water and its connection to modern day mining and agriculture of the Great Artesian Basin.

The Museum also houses many other historic collections and displays such as the Shell Collection, Streetscape Collection and the War Museum. At the time of writing, the entrance fee is \$24 for adults, \$21 for Seniors and \$12 for students, children under school age are free. For more information about the Miles Historical Village Museum go to www.mhv.org.au.
