"Love your neighbor as yourself" ... Scripture says this a lot. Lev 19:18, Matt 19:19, Matt 22:39, Mark 12:31, Luke 10:27, Rom 13:9, Gal 5:14, James 2:8

One of the ways to consider this is: think of your neighbor as though it was yourself in their position.

Empathy (*the ability to understand and share the feelings of another*) can be very difficult, however. How often have you said something like "I can't even imagine what they must be going through"?

This year and this pandemic are giving us a rare opportunity. In all of its difficulties, this year can teach us empathy, if we let it.

Rather than thinking about ourselves, let's take the opportunity to think of others.

When we feel trapped in our homes ... let's pray for those who are in prison, for those in nursing homes, for those with disabilities that limit their mobility in one way or another.

When we feel sad that someone is not able to visit over the holidays ... let's pray for the families of our service men and women, for those who have moved a great distance for one reason or another and cannot easily visit with family, for those who are mourning the death of a loved one.

When we feel frustrated because of the loss of "normal" and everything seems turned upside down ... let's pray for those who lost their homes to natural disasters (fire, flood, hurricane), for those who have lost their job, for those in the foster care system.

This year has been hard, but for many the difficulties will not end with a vaccine. Let's remember those in need with our prayers and our generosity.

The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on November 24, 2020

Opened in prayer and studied scripture from the Frontier Fellowship Advent Devotional.

Minutes approved from October session meeting.

Approved budget for 2021.

Approved painting in sanctuary to begin in the early 2021.

Approved Christmas Eve services at 5:00pm & 7:00pm.

VBS was scheduled for June 14-18, 2021

Annual Congregational meeting was scheduled to take place at 12:00 noon on January 17, 2021 (Snow/COVID rescheduled date 1/24/20) Pastor Andrew is planning to make it an option to attend the meeting via zoom if possible.

Received committee reports from committee chairs.

Spent a significant amount of time discussing the reality of the COVID situation for our church and our community. COVID UPDATE

Cases are rising nationwide and in our county. In a way, it is not as scary as it was in the spring because we know more about the disease now, but there are far more cases now than there were even in the worst weeks of the spring, especially in our area. As hospitals become overwhelmed, it can still be very dangerous.

Positive test rate in our county has passed 11%; previously we had been told the goal was to keep it below 5%.

Death toll nationwide has surpassed 250,000. (By comparison, the flu is around 30,000.) 179 people have died in our county. The situation is likely to get worse after Thanksgiving.

A Georgia Tech project based on available statistics estimates that any given worship service (even as few as 15 people in the room) has a more that 1 in 3 chance of someone in the room being contagious.

We already know of members of the church who have COVID and several cases where a family member of someone in the church has or had COVID.

Many schools are making the move to online only.

Church leadership does not want to stop in person worship or close the building to visitors during the week, but we should all be prepared for new state or federal guidelines in the weeks to come. We should also prepare for the very real possibility that, if we maintain in person worship and open offices during the week, there could be an outbreak among our congregation.

Also, though he is taking every precaution he can reasonably take, we must be prepared for the possibility that Pastor Andrew will test positive for COVID. At least one pastor in our presbytery has tested positive for COVID and it forced a shut down for their church.

We all need to work together. Care for one another. Please follow the guidelines, here at church and everywhere you go. Wear a mask whenever you are with someone not from your household. Stay home if you have symptoms. Stay home if you have been exposed to someone who tested positive.

We are not just a church, we are a family. We love one another. We look out for one another. Thank you for all that you have done to protect one another and support one another this year!

PRESCHOOL NEWS

A member of the WHPC staff, preschool teacher Andrea Tuttoilmondo, has tested positive for COVID-19 over the Thanksgiving weekend.

As a result it was necessary to close the West Hempfield Preschool for at least two weeks. Looking ahead at the month of December and the Christmas break that was already scheduled later in the month, the teachers decided to close the preschool for the entire month of December. We will reopen on January 4, if we feel it is safe to do so.


