Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!

As the structure of our in-person worship service finds its way back to "normal," this Lent we are bringing back the Corporate Prayer of Confession. Of course, in this environment, it is up to you whether you speak the words with me or just read them silently. Spoken or silent, we pray together to humble ourselves. Without a confession of our own sin, we risk thinking it is our own righteousness, rather than the Lord's, that opens the door and allows us to be in God's presence.

The PCUSA Book of Order recommends the Prayer of Confession and Assurance of Pardon saying ... Having praised the holiness of God, we must also face the sinful state of the world and of our lives, confessing our unworthiness to enter into God's presence. Nevertheless we approach God with confidence, trusting in the mercy of Jesus Christ. This turn from communal praise to corporate confession, established on the promise of God's grace, is one of the hallmarks of the Reformed tradition.

A call to confession expresses God's initiative in calling for repentance and promising forgiveness in Christ. As members of Christ's body, we confess the reality of sin, captivity, and brokenness in personal and common life and ask for God's saving grace. A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name.

Other actions may follow—a song of praise, such as "Glory be to the Father"

Lent in Plain Sight: A Devotion through Ten Objects By Jill J. Duffield

God is often at work through the ordinary: ordinary people, ordinary objects, ordinary grace. Through the ordinary, God communicates epiphanies, salvation, revelation, and reconciliation. It is through the mundane that we hear God's quiet voice.



In this devotion for the season of Lent, Jill J. Duffield draws readers attention to ten ordinary objects that Jesus would have encountered on his way to Jerusalem: dust, bread, the cross, coins, shoes, oil, coats, towels, thorns, and stones. In each object, readers will find meaning in the biblical account of Jesus final days. Each week, readers encounter a new object to consider through Scripture, prayer, and reflection. From Ash Wednesday to Easter, Lent in Plain Sight reminds Christians to open ourselves to the kingdom of God.

Jill J. Duffield is editor of *The Presbyterian Outlook*. She holds an MDiv from Union Presbyterian Seminary and a DMin from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary with a concentration in preaching. She lives in Charlottesville, Virginia.
