October is the month of Halloween.

The hot summer days turn cooler and a chill runs up your spine. Each day the sun shines just a little bit shorter and the darkness grows. Decorations of skeletons, witches, and ghosts abound.

October is a month of Fear.

October is also the month of Stewardship.

We don't want to wait until the last minute, so the plan is always to approve next year's budget in November. That means presenting the first draft at the October Session meeting. Inevitably this always leads to a lot of conversations about budgets and stewardship in October.

October is a month of Generosity.

But Fear and Generosity really do not go together.

Fear can be a good thing. Fear can protect us from danger. Fear can alert us to risks and encourage caution. Fear can bring focus and sharpen our senses.

But fear also makes us put our defenses up. When we are afraid, we withdraw or hide. We lock the doors. We build walls, literally or metaphorically. We plan, we prepare, we stockpile. Fear is isolating, suspicious of others, and self-focused. Generosity, on the other hand, requires openness and vulnerability. Generosity builds bridges with others. We risk personal security and safety when we offer what we have to others. Generosity is

uniting, compassionate, and other-focused.

was happening. He knew what was going to happen. It was terrifying. There was plenty to be afraid of, but he chose generosity. He gave all that he had, even his life, so that we might be saved.

On the night that Jesus was arrested, his followers were scared. Mostly, they ran away. One man turned violent and attacked someone in the crowd.

And still Jesus was generous. He immediately put a stop to the violence and healed the man who had come to arrest him.

Fear can prevent us from being generous. But generosity can help us to overcome our fears.

Generosity can connect us to the needs of others. It can help us to get our minds off of ourselves and our fears. Helping to meet the needs of others gives us something to do, a sense of direction and purpose when fear makes us feel lost. Sharing what we have helps us to place our trust in the Lord who provides, rather than in the things themselves.

Life is full of things to fear, but God calls us to go beyond our fear and to greet the world with generosity.

What used to be called the "per capita" has been replaced by the "First Fruits" campaign of Redstone Presbytery. Regardless of what we call it, this is our denominational support. Each of us has the opportunity to support the work of the Presbytery, Synod, and National levels of our church, the PCUSA, in the work they do.

It is a beautiful example of the power of small things in large numbers.
