My family has been enjoying a show on Netflix called "Is It Cake?" In the show, bakers compete to create a delicious cake that looks convincingly like something else entirely. We've seen a burger, a shoe, a purse, hats, toys, and more!

#### How do we know what is real?

In Matthew chapter 23 Jesus talks about things that look real, but are not. He isn't talking about cake though, he's talking about people.

Verse 3 *they do not practice what they preach,* and verse 5 *Everything they do is done for people to see.* 

#### How do we know what is real?

Jesus uses the term "hypocrite" for those who are not real. His accusation is that (like the cakes in the show) the hypocrites have created an outward appearance that hides what is truly on the inside.

Verse 28 On the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness.

#### How do we know what is real?

To help answer our question, I was thinking about some of our Christmas decorations — especially the Christmas tree. Decorating pine trees with lights and ornaments has become an exciting part of many of our Christmas celebrations. And artificial trees are incredibly popular. They are easier in many ways. Long lasting. Pre-lit. No shedding needles. Etc. Like the hypocrites Jesus spoke of, they look great on the outside, but they are not real. They are not full of life.

They might fool the eyes, but they won't fool the other senses. They don't have the same feel or the same smell.

The Bible actually talks about smell too. II Corinthians 2:15 *For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ.* 

#### How do we know what is real?

Looking back to what Jesus said in Matthew 23:23 the hypocrites *have neglected the more important matters of the law—justice, mercy and faithfulness.* 

Even if we decorate artificial Christmas trees ... Even if we have trouble answering "Is it cake?" ... I pray that we will all be real followers of Jesus, full of life, and sharing the aroma of Christ ... justice, mercy, and faithfulness

#### **2023 WORSHIP SCHEDULE**

Like so many other places, we have struggled to recover after the COVID pandemic. Our goal is to get back to a place where we have two well-attended Sunday morning worship services. It's going to take some work, and maybe some sacrifice, to make that happen. Right now, our low attendance numbers (occasionally single digits at one service or the other) are not welcoming to guests.

In an attempt to create a more full, warm room for guests to be inspired to return, church leadership has decided to ask the congregation to join together in a single Sunday morning service from Christmas through Ash Wednesday, and then again after VBS through Labor Day (exact dates for the summer are still TBD)

Starting December 25, 2022 through February 19, 2023 we will have only an 11:00am worship service, with 9:45am Sunday School. From February 26 through June 18, 2023 we will have worship at 8:30am and 11:00am with Sunday School at 9:45 (until SS begins summer break). For a period of the summer after VBS we will have only an 8:30am worship service. In the fall we will return to worship at 8:30am and 11:00am with Sunday School at 9:45.

This schedule will be reevaluated at the end of 2023 as we continue our attempts to grow our congregation and get back to two well-attended Sunday morning services every week.

- We approved a schedule for 2023, which will be finalized and shared with the congregation soon, where several Sundays in 2023 will have only one service. For a portion of the winter there will be only an 11:00AM service and for a portion of the summer there will be only an 8:30 service.
