Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!

I know it shouldn't surprise me, but, honestly, I am still amazed sometimes by how the words of Scripture, written so long ago, still speak so poignantly to our unique circumstances today.

The world keeps changing and God's Word still has the answers.

Today I am thinking about what Jesus says to the Samaritan woman at the well in John chapter 4.

Concerned about the theological and practical differences between the way the Jews and the Samaritans worship God, she says "Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem." [John 4:20] Not exactly a question. But in the statement is a concern: What is the right way to worship? Am I doing it wrong?

Today, we might say it in different ways, but many are still expressing the same concern. Presbyterian, Methodist, Catholic, Non-denominational. One church sings to music played on an organ, another a guitar. Communion is served with grape juice here, wine there. Scripture is read from KJV, NIV, NRSV, the Message, or some other translation. In one church the congregations sits in permanently installed pews, in another the congregation sits in stackable chairs that have to be set up and removed each week. A single service, two services, multiple services. Small room, big room, multi-site.

And now we are even adding more questions with in-person versus online, live versus on-demand. *What is the right way to worship? Am I doing it wrong?*

The world keeps changing and God's Word still has the answers.

At an event recently, the speaker addressed a group of pastors and said, "Your people are no longer all in the building." This one sentence, more than anything else he said, keeps echoing in my head.

We could get judgmental about this. *That is not the right way to worship. They are doing it wrong.*

But I think that is exactly what Jesus is telling us NOT to do as he responds to the Samaritan woman at the well.

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks." [John 4:23]

The world keeps changing and God's Word still has the answers.

In the Spirit and in Truth. That's all that really matters.

"Your people are no longer in the building."

They/You may no longer be in the building for one reason or another, but they/you are still a part of the congregation, the family, the mission.

How can we love and support everyone? I don't have all the answers yet. But I know where they can be found. Let's keep looking together.

The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on Tuesday, August 23, 2022

A few elders were unavailable, but a quorum was present as we gathered in the lobby to cover our church, congregation, and community with prayer and review all that has been going on with the church and the world.

- Reflected on Scripture using the daily entry from Our Daily Bread devotional (copies available in the church lobby at no cost to you)
- Approved Session minutes from June and July 2022
- Reviewed reports from the clerk, pastor, treasurer, deacons, and WHPC committees
- Reviewed and reaffirmed church Sexual Misconduct and Child Safety Policies
- Discussed the church financial position, sanctuary air conditioners, and "Sanctuary Refresh" ideas
- Set the date of the next Haiti spaghetti dinner for October 22, 2022
- Approved a rental request for a birthday party on November 26

• WHPC filed the paperwork to help Adamsburg Fire Department receive a grant for their Project Breathe Clean. The church will not be making a direct donation (beyond our annual budgeted gift), but by endorsing them in this paperwork, we can help them receive a \$5000 grant.

- Discussed possible usages of RightNow Media and possibility of subscribing in the future.
- The September meeting would regularly be on September 27, however this conflicts with Pastor Andrew's scheduled vacation. So the September Session meeting will be held on October 4
