Matthew 25:1-13

The foolish ones said to the wise, "Give us some of your oil; our lamps are going out." "No," they replied.

Last month's book, *Lent in Plain Sight* by Jill J. Duffield, asked an interesting question in reflection on the meaning of this parable.

"What cannot be shared, borrowed, or even bought?"

The idea seems a little strange. We live in a world of commercialism. Everything has a price tag. It seems like you can buy anything and everything, and probably have it delivered by Friday.

What is the oil meant to represent? What does God want us to cultivate and maintain in our lives that can't be found on Amazon Prime?

And whatever it is, why can't the wise share it? Everywhere else in Scripture Jesus praises generosity, but here are the wise really selfishly hoarding supplies?

The answer may be more clear if we change our focus. Forget the oil for a moment and look to the groom ... Jesus. What do we need to be ready to meet Jesus today? To see him at work in this world, even through the darkness?

What we need (the oil) might not always be the same. Different people, different situations, different seasons in life. But if we keep our focus on Jesus, we will know what we really need to let his light shine in our lives.

The most important things in life (like the Fruit of the Spirt—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control) can't be bought or borrowed, but are gifts from God to be used and cherished.





The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on March 23, 2021

- The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on March 23, 2021 with a mixture of Zoom and in-person attendance.
- Together we covered our church and congregation with prayer, studied the Bible, discussed upcoming events, and reviewed the submitted reports.
- For our Bible Study time we read from Max Lucado's book *On Calvary's Hill* and reflected on John 12:1-8.
- We approved the February minutes and received and reviewed staff and committee reports.
- Dates for VBS were approved as June 14-18 in the evening with Sunday, June 20 being "VBS Sunday".
- Conversation about sanctuary microphones getting worse and needing replacement.
- Conversation about continuing to use individually packaged communion elements. We will continue to use these and will attempt passing them out from the trays during worship on May 2.


