On August 2, one of our Scripture readings will be the story of the feeding of the 5,000. (Matthew 14:13 -21) In the story, everyone is tired. It's been a long day. The disciples just want everyone to go away. But Jesus takes a small amount of food and shares with everyone without running out.

There is a similar story in the Old Testament (I Kings 17:7-16) where Elijah encounters a widow who is about to run out of food, but because she shows kindness and faithfulness in feeding Elijah, her small amount of flour and olive oil never ran out.

Some people think that most things in life are a "Zero Sum Game." In a Zero Sum Game there is a fixed number of resources. Therefore, if someone gains or advances, it is necessarily at the loss of someone else.

But I believe the Bible tells us about the abundance of God, blessings that do not run out, that do not divide or subtract, but multiply.

I personally have never seen one small loaf of bread feed thousands or a small bit of flour last for days, but I have seen one act of kindness spread and grow to have great impact. I have seen the faith of one person inspire many.

God's Kingdom is not a Zero Sum Game. God's blessings are not limited. When we sacrifice, we also receive.

Many people are struggling right now, in many different ways. And that might include you. As we pray and seek God's presence and blessings, may we not forget the needs of others either, and be generous where we can.

It was in sharing what little they had and serving others that the disciples, and the widow, were able to see the amazing power of God and were themselves fed too.
