What comes to your mind when you hear the names of Isaiah 9:6? What do they reveal to us about God? About Jesus? Join us Sunday mornings in December as we explore these names together.

NOVEMBER SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church met on November 26, 2019

Together we covered our church and congregation with prayer, studied the Bible, discussed upcoming events, and reviewed the submitted reports.

For our Bible study we read Deuteronomy 26:1-11. *Deut. 26:11 Then you ... shall rejoice in all the good things the Lord your God has given to you and your household.* We went around the table and everyone shared what they are thankful for.

We received and reviewed staff and committee reports.

The big job this month was the presentation and first official read of the 2020 budget. The elders were walked through the budget from start to finish and will have a few weeks to review it and ask any questions they may have before voting on it and sending it to the congregational meeting.


The congregational meeting will be held on January 26 after our one service at 11am. All information for the annual report will be due to the church office by January 5, 2020.

The Session reviewed and approved a few rental opportunities for the Fellowship Hall and discussed the progress on the sign on Arona Road, as well as the possibility of setting up a place for a banner closer to the church building.

Building Committee noted some repairs that have been completed around the building and encourage everyone to NOT use tape on any exterior doors. Magnets are available in the office if needed.

The Session will meet briefly in December to approve the 2020 budget. Due to Christmas Eve, the next full agenda session meeting is scheduled for January 28 at 6:30pm.
