## **Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!**

Lent begins this month.

Lent is the season, 40 days (not counting Sundays), before Easter Sunday. A season of preparation, reflection, sometimes fasting, hopefully spiritual growth and deeper connection with God.

I think it is interesting how Lent 2024 starts. Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is Valentine's Day this year!

I find myself still thinking about that unusual combination. The celebration, thrill, and excitement of romantic love mixed with the humility of the ash meant to remind us of our mortality.

But, then again, that seems like a great example of the tension of Lent. Every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection, a mini-Easter. In Lent that is mixed with the themes of humility, repentance, and preparation for the Easter that is to come.

The Psalms, as they so often do, help us to express these difficult, conflicting emotions. Many of the psalms help us with our praises:

"The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" (Psalm 27:1)

"Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion!" (Psalm 147:14)

"The LORD has done great things for us, and we rejoiced." (Psalm 126:3)

Many of the psalms help us express our frustrations, worries, sorrow, and laments:

"My heart is stricken and withered like grass; I am too wasted to eat my bread." (Psalm 102:4)

Whatever emotions we may be feeling this Lent, the psalms remind us that we are not alone. Others have walked this path before us. Their poetic words give voice to the feelings we struggle to name. And we can be reassured that in the celebration, the thrill, the excitement; and in the humility, the repentance, the preparation; and even in the frustrations, worries, sorrow, and laments, the Lord is there with us as well.


". . . that he looked down from his holy height, from heaven the LORD looked at the earth." (Psalm 102:19)

We will be celebrating communion together as a part of our worship service on Sunday, February 4, 2024 at 10:00am and we would love for you to join us!



## WINTER WEATHER UPDATES

Decisions about winter weather cancellation of worship will be made the day of the service (so as not to be premature, weather and conditions can change quickly).

If we need to cancel because of bad roads or ice at the church, a message will be sent out one hour before the start of worship using the new text message service and Constant Contact email service.

### Preschool Enrollment is open for the 2024/2025 school year.

Class is Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday from 9:00am to 11:30am for the morning class or 12:30pm to 3:00pm for the afternoon class.

The program is designed for 3- & 4-year old children. (The child must be 3 by August 31 and potty-trained.)

Tuition for the 2024/2025 school year will be \$120 per month.

## C.E. PJ PARTY AND MOVIE NIGHT


Saturday, February 24 5:30-8PM
