# Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!

At the session meeting on June 30, we looked at Matthew 8:23-27. Taking the idea from an app on my phone called **Pray As You Go**, we imagined ourselves as the disciples in the boat, surrounded by the chaos of the storm at sea, and turning to Christ for help. Imagining chaos in our own lives (past or present) we called out with the disciples: "Lord, save me, I'm going down."

I was struck by the answer Jesus gives. "Why are you afraid, you of little faith?"

Yes, Jesus calmed the storm, but he is not happy that the disciples asked him for help.

The moral of this story does not seem to be the same as I Peter 5:7 *Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.* 

Context is often helpful. A few verses earlier in Matthew, Jesus was telling someone who expressed interest in following him that it would not be an easy journey.

Could Jesus be telling the disciples, and us, the same thing in this story? Following him will not be an easy journey. Don't look for the easy way out.

Jesus cares deeply for us and about the hardships of our lives. If that were not true he would not have come to earth to save us, nor would he have died and rose again to show us the Way to God the Father.

As the chaos threatens your boat, remember that Jesus is in the boat with you. Rather than asking him to make it stop, can we find the courage to ask what we can do, what we can learn, and how this all might be leading us to God's kingdom?

# Pastor Andrew Recommends: Mail a letter

Faced with the challenges of the COVID-19 shut downs and physical distancing, I struggled to come up with ideas for how to maintain a connection to the congregation that I couldn't see at church or go visit.

After Easter I sat down with the church directory and just started writing letters. Over 100 letters took longer than I thought, but I mailed the last one before the end of June.

I will admit, at times, it felt like a chore, but it truly was a blessing to take the time not just to write, but to stop and think about and pray for each of these families that make up West Hempfield Presbyterian Church.

You won't find me saying that the pandemic is a good thing and I don't want to go through a shut down again, but I'm sure I wouldn't have had the time, opportunity, or motivation to write all those letters otherwise.

Having written them, I'm glad I did. So my July recommendation is to write a letter. You don't have to write 100; try starting with one. Don't type. Get out a pen and paper. Take your time. Draw a doodle. Add a sticker. (Here's a secret: Write with a marker instead of a pen; it fills the page faster.) Offer a prayer as you write the address and add the stamp.

Jesus said, "Love your neighbor."

Why not send them a letter?
